

# WILD ROSE

## Big Mining Deals and Great Activity

The Goldfield Sun says: The new town of Wild Rose in the Panamint range is in the center of a proven district. Water is to be piped in and the supply will be furnished by gravity. The leasing system is to be adopted in the mines of the district.

Mr. E. S. Chafey, who has just returned from the Wild Rose District, states that everything is booming in that section. The pipe line to carry water from Telescope peak to the Skidoo mines and other sections of the Wild Rose District is under construction. This will be over 24 miles long, and cost fully \$150,000; and there will be sufficient water to generate 200 horse power for electric energy.

W. W. Webb, who is associated with Oddie and Luetjens, left for Wild Rose this week accompanied by L. A. Lacon. Mr. Webb will at once start development on their ground, which is located near the property of the Wild Rose

Company, in Trail Canyon, Wild Rose District.

Work on the tunnel of the Wild Rose Mining Company for the past week has progressed rapidly. Assays had on the ore this week gave \$169.84.

Goodpasture and associates are actively engaged developing their ground near the Skidoo.

Assays taken from the Desert Rose Company ground give \$137.08. Some samples show plenty of free gold.

Weather still continues to be very pleasant at Emigrant Springs and around Harrisburg and the Trail Canyon section.

On the Skidoo every one is hustling, 24 men are engaged and a number more are to be employed. Mat Hoveck, manager of the Skidoo, says: "Tell the boys in Bullfrog that the Skidoo beats the Shoshone consolidated and then some."

Postoffice, stage and railroad communication, telegraph and telephone lines, are possibilities for the near future for the Wild Rose District.

George Badgett will probably go to Greenwater, where he is interested in mines.

Mr. Fifield of the Cliff Bullfrog has gone to Los Angeles on business. Will return September 1.

John McKane has returned from Europe and is fishing for whale in Canada, little caring about the stories published concerning his mining speculations.

# DOWN 400 FEET

## The Montgomery-Shoshone Mine Deeper and Richer

Apparently there is no bottom to the gold and silver bearing talc and quartz in the famous Schwab property. The shaft is now down to the 400 foot level and the workmen are sinking and drifting in a great body of high grade ore. Evidently the Shoshone has struck one of the chimneys leading down to Pluto's laboratories.

The work of testing the various ores is nearly finished and the order for the mill and reduction works will soon be placed.

Millions of tons of high and low grade ores have been blocked out in the Shoshone and Polaris and a large force of men will be employed when the reduction works are ready to treat the product of the mines.

L. D. Porter has been at the end of the Clark railroad, attending to shipments. He says ties are now coming in and the railroad may reach Beatty before August 1. The track is only fifteen miles away.

The Clark Railroad company is sinking a well at Johnnie Siding. It is down 350 feet, and may have to go 200 feet more to reach water. There is plenty of water at Johnnie townsite.
