SUPPLEMENT

NEVADA ORE OUTPUT

Ninety per cent of the ore yielded by Nevada and passing through the hands of the ore buyers are coming from Goldfield and Tonopah, and consignments are averaging 500 tons daily, or at the rate 15,000 tons per month. These ores will average at a conservative estimate, \$60 per ton, aggregating \$900,000, and if maintained regularly, therefore form an output of \$6,300,000 per year, of which there is a record. What the yield of ores is which do not reach the sampler cannot be estimated, says the Deseret News.

When the other 10 per cent of the state's yield which is not included above is considered, it is readily seen that Southern Nevada is now outputting at least \$1,000 .-000 per month or at the rate of \$12,000,000 to \$15,000,000 per year without including the newer districts like Bullfrog and Manhattan. which have just started to get ready to ship.

DISCRIMINATION

The recent decision by the New York courts that transfers of mining stock must pay a tax of two cents per share, is attributed largely to the influence of Standard Oil men who realize that the money being invested in Nevada stocks is jeopardizing their chances of disposing of inflated industrials.

At Searchlight a non-partisan league has been formed to cooperate with the one recently organized at Las Vegas. J. O. McIntosh reports a strong and unanimous sentiment in the southern mining town, in regard to standing together for the interests of this end of the county. Petty politics will give way to more vital issues.

Petty officers who are unsatisfactory to a majority of the people can be easily disposed of at the first election. County division, county seat and town government are matters of more importance and will supercede personal politics before election time.

At Ely the Nevada Consolidation company has sites surveyed for a smelter at two points, one at Ely and the other twelve miles away. The later will probably be adopted. The smelter will establish a community of 3,000

For the protection of the mining investors of the United States, the American Mining Congress has established a bureau of inquiry, through which information can be obtained as to the condition of the property and the standing of the company that has asked or is asking for the money of the investor.

> The licenses of the Traders, Home Fire and Marine and the Firemen's Fund insurance companies have been cancelled. They refused to pay dollar for dollar on their San Francisco losses.

> A new smelter process invented by John S. Loder, it is claimed, will cheapen the business of ore reduction. By the use of hydrogen gas the cost will be about onehalf where oil can be obtained cheaply.

> Thousands of Nevada range horses are being rounded up by vaqueros who are employed by buyers who have come here from the Southern states to obtain Western stock to work in the cotton fields.

A topographic map of Death Valley and southern mining camps has just been completed by the government. It shows the springs, roads and trails and can be purchased for 15c a copy from the director of the geological survey at Washington, D. C.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture proposes to experiment with camels on the western deserts. They will be used to hunt outlaws and perform such other feats as can only be performed by an animal that can go eight days without a drink.

The people of Nevada should and undoubtedly do welcome heartily Senator Clark's activity in building branch railroad lines to the producing regions. There is probably no railroad man in the United States who so well understands the needs of a mining country, or who can, through his knowledge of and connection with competent mining engineers so thoroughly know the prospective value of these regions.
