

WILD ROSE

Will Be Scene of Rush This Fall

Several prospectors returned the fore part of the week from Wild Rose and report a most favorable state of conditions existing there. Regardless of the hardships encountered in going into the district many are going in, and it is a certainty that there is to be a big rush to that section this fall. The district is a large one and the mineral is not confined to one metal, but embraces gold, copper, silver and lead, and frequently all four are found in the same ore.

W. W. Webb, associated with Oddie and Luetjens returned to Beatty from Wild Rose Monday, coming in for supplies and to have assays made. He has been developing property jointly owned by him and associates, and considers he has one of the best showings in the district. His samples assayed away up in the hundreds, and he returns in a few days.

Work still continues in the tunnel on the property of the Wild Rose Mining company, and is now in about 40 feet, with about that distance yet to go before the point under the rich surface

croppings is reached. The tunnel follows the ledge, and assays are gradually becoming higher as depth is gained. About three tons of the sorted material are in sacks and ready to ship. A great quantity of highgrade ore awaits the sorter on the dump, the amount steadily growing as the tunnel pierces the hill. A number of properties will have shipping material by fall.

Work is to be resumed on the Harrisburg property this fall.

W. B. Gray and family left the fore part of the week for Wild Rose and will remain there the remainder of the summer. Mr. Gray is associated with Dr. C. V. Withee and others in the Wild Rose Mining company.

Bullfrog Nevada

The shaft on the Bullfrog Nevada is down 100 feet, sinking still continuing. No assays have been made for 50 feet, but the bottom of the shaft is in fine looking mineralized rock, and there should be a great improvement over the surface assays. P. J. Summers, president of the company is expected in Beatty in a few days, and upon his arrival a thorough sampling will be made. It is Mr. Summers' intention to let a contract for another 100 feet before crosscutting. This property is located one mile southwest of Beatty.

GREENWATER

Water Supply a Most Serious Problem

A. Effner arrived in Beatty Monday from the Greenwater country and like all travelers from there is enthusiastic over the new big copper district. He came in for the express purpose of securing supplies and leaves for there within the week. We gathered the following information from him.

Water is too scarce to permit much work, but still there is considerable going on. The nearest water is 14 miles, and even there the supply is limited, that many teams and burro outfits are forced to lay over several days in order to get their supply. The Borax Co., owning the Furnace creek water, have a tank about four miles above the ranch in the wash, the water being piped from a small spring among the hills a mile distant. Recently a cloudburst damaged the pipe, and before it was repaired and the water flowing again into the tank, the canyon was filled with teams and outfits waiting to fill their cans and barrels.

Fourteen miles south of Greenwater are Hidden Springs, but the flow is so meagre there that Mr. Effner spent an

entire day in filling five five-gallon oil cans. Teams cannot reach the springs from Greenwater, and it hardly pays to visit them with a burro string.

Work is actively going on at both the Clark and Kunze camp, a gasolite hoist being in operation at the former. The water is hauled from the Borax company's tank, and extreme difficulty is met with in keeping a sufficient supply on hand. Half of the time there is even a shortage in the cooking and domestic allowance. It is hoped that the supply can be augmented in some manner at an early date. Nevertheless the scarcity of water and the prevalent heat have but little influence toward keeping out the prospector and investor.

From all reports copper seems to be everywhere. A dozen instances are known when location work was started in an absolutely unstained formation, and at a depth of several feet the miner breaking into the richest kind of copper stained ore, and colored as the rainbow.

The air is full of reports of big sales and strikes, but it is hard to get authentic information just at the present. No doubt most of them are true or partially so. Later we will be in more direct communication with the wonderful district.
