

# WILD ROSE

## Five Big Strikes the Last Week

B. Epstein came up from Wild Rose Monday morning, brimful of mining news from the district. He states that every property holder in the country has been working and prospecting diligently, with the result that five distinct strikes were made last week. One was his own, and he considers he has a most excellent prospect. The samples of ore that he brought back with him pan as few samples do, and the general run of the ore in Wild Rose is of base nature.

Messrs. Raycroft and Allen, owning a group of claims two miles east of the Skidoo, have discovered a ledge 75 feet wide, and a careful sampling of the entire width gave returns of \$14 per ton. This great ledge is very strong, is traceable for a long distance, and is on the Death Valley slope of the Panamints. It is on this vein that Mr. Epstein made his strike, the outcrop being plainly visible through both groups.

A prospector named Ryan, and an associate, recently made a strike that is a wonder. They have uncovered a three

foot vein of quartz that assays as high as \$1900 per ton in gold, and with an average running up in the hundreds. This find was made near the Skidoo, the character of the ore being similar.

On the Skidoo, the property that Bob Montgomery is making more famous than the Montgomery-Shoshone, thirty men are working. Mr. Epstein considers this property one of the greatest he has ever inspected, and will some day have a wonderful production. Two shafts are each down about 85 feet, and though the ore was rich enough on top, it is not a circumstance to what it is at the bottom of the shafts. Quantities of the free ore are plentiful all over and through the ore, and a great amount of high grade is being accumulated on the dump, taken out in the course of development.

A large force of men are working on the pipe line that Mr. Montgomery and associates are putting into the Skidoo, and it is estimated that the work will be completed by Christmas. When the line is in, a townsite will be laid out in the vicinity of the Skidoo. At present there are a number of tents on the ground, the habitations of prospectors.

Development on the Will Rose Mining company's property is progressing favorably, the values growing with depth. The dump of shipping ore is daily increasing in size, and this company will be one of the first to commence shipping as soon as conditions are favorable.

The last week has witnessed considerable excitement at Sheep Mountain,

north of Emigrant springs. Parties coming into the springs report several strikes in the range, and about 50 prospectors scattered throughout the mountains. The range is about 20 miles in length, and it has long been known that it was more or less mineralized.

It is announced that Mr. Montgomery will lease part of his holdings in Wild Rose district, and that many applications have already been made for blocks of ground.

E. S. Hoyt, manager of the Montgomery Hotel, and W. F. Mitchell have purchased a group of claims in Wild Rose from Mr. Epstein, and the latter of the purchasers intends leaving for there within the next ten days.

### Stovepipe Springs

B. Epstein, who came in from Wild Rose Monday, stated to the Miner man that water at the above springs is not poisonous as was stated by our Rhyolite contemporaries. The party or parties claiming to have nearly perished from drinking the water, would have suffered no ill effects had they taken the precaution to skim off the scum that accumulates on the surface of the water when not used or disturbed for a few days. The water contains sulphur and other minerals, and at no time makes a pleasant beverage, but if several bucketsful are thrown out and the spring partially drained the liquid will taste all right to the thirsty. Mr. Epstein says he drank the water all summer, and has yet the first time to feel bad effects from it.

## Scotty Saves a Prospector

A prospector recently in from Death Valley, reports to have met Scotty, the namesake of the depression, at Emigrant springs on the 6th of this month on his way to Los Angeles. With him was a prospector he had found on the desert, nearly dead from thirst, some one from Beatty whose name we are unable to find out. The rescued, through ignorance of the country, had wandered off into the salt marsh, lost his burros, and would surely have perished had not Scotty found him in his crazy wanderings.

For three hours Scotty remained at Emigrant springs, claiming to have come that day from Mesquite springs, a distance of 50 miles. Slim, the stage-famed mule, and two others were loaded down with ore, or at least Scotty claimed they were, but he did not offer to open any of the sacks and make his claim good, but showed a number of specimens that he carried in his pockets. If they were fair samples of what the sacks contained, he sure had a valuable cargo aboard, but there was no way of ascertaining that they were. Of course Scotty said they were.

While resting, Scotty made a play of several rolls of bills of high denominations, and in the two saloons at Emigrant spent something like fifty dollars, allowing no one but himself to pay for the drinks. In the cool of the evening he pulled out, saying as he departed: "They all claim I am boosting California, but just as soon as I get in New York I will show them that California is boosting me."
