### COMMISSIONERS

#### Official Minutes of the County Board

Office of the Clerk September 3, 1906.  
The Board of County Commissioners met on this date, there being present Jas. A. Nesbitt, member; Geo. C. Baldwin, member and Eugene Goodrich, clerk.

The minutes of the meeting of August 9th, 1906, were read and approved. It appearing from communications that Geo. W. Morgan, who was appointed registry agent of Crescent precinct was absent, and upon recommendation, P. O. Chilstrom was appointed as registry agent of Crescent precinct and so informed by wire.

The salary and general bills were allowed as per register of claims. Two bills for roadwork in Delamar road district, were returned to have the O. K. of the road supervisor.

A bill of J. W. Bradshaw for road work was laid over until October meeting.

Mr. F. W. Diekle appeared before the board and asked that lots 5, 6, 7 and 8 block 33, be recovered by a deed, and that the treasurer be empowered to make a deed to Mrs. L. Frank.

A bill of \$10.00 from W. P. Murray of Caliente, was rejected for the reason it was considered the amounts of the bill were not just claims against the county.

A petition from Logan was read asking for an appropriation of \$500 for road and bridge work between Logan and the railroad station. An order was made that an allowance of \$200 be made from the general county fund, this amount to be returned from Moapa and Virgin road fund as soon as this amount is received in said road fund.

A Petition was received from Panaca, asking for the appointment of Jos. Rice as Justice of the Peace of Panaca township. An order was made that the petition be returned to have representative signatures of the tax payers of said Panaca township.

A petition was received from Bunkerville asking for an appropriation of \$500

An order was made that on the payment of \$25 Luke Syphus have possession of lots 7 and 8, block 26, Pioche township, this amount being considered as taxes due on said lots.

An order was made to advertise for bids for 35 cords of dry Cedar wood, to be delivered at the court house in Pioche, the Board to reserve the right to reject any and all bids.

A bill of \$150 presented by Eugene Goodrich, for extra book work was rejected.

A petition was received from Delamar asking for the appointment of Robert

Bruges as road supervisor of Delamar Road District No. 5. After consideration the appointment of Robert Bruges was made for said road district.

An order was made by the Board for an allowance of \$200 for clerk hire during the term of tax collections to the Tax Collector of Lincoln county.

The Board then adjourned until Oct. 1st, 1906. EUGENE GOODRICH, Clerk.

### WATER FOR MINES

Ash Meadows Water Company Organized

Telegrams announce the organization at Portland, Maine, of the Ash Meadows Water Company, to supply mining camps in Nevada and California. The capital is \$5,000,000, James C. Kipp, of Pittsburg, Pa., president, and Edwin H. Stauber, of Scranton, Pa., secretary.

At Ash Meadows an enormous volume of water runs to waste, and may now be utilized in Bullfrog and Funeral Range mines.

Laws may prevent the carrying of water from Nevada to California mines. The Greenwater copper camp is greatly in need of the water.
