JUSTICE CASE

Judge Brown Decides in Fa- Las Vegas First, Searchlight vor of Lillis

Las Vegas' famous justice of the peace tangle was unraveled at Pioche Wed-precincts from which returns have been nesday by Judge Brown.

A decree was issued in accordance for two or three places on the ticket, with these findings, and H. M.
