FOR TERMINAL POINT

At Kuhn Mercantile Company's store Sunday, a number of business men met to discuss the possibility of terminal freight rates for Las Vegas. N. A. Kuhn was elected president and Chas. C. Corkhill, secretary.

W. E. Hawkins, W. R. Thomas, A. W. Jurden, Ed. W. Clark and E. W. Griffith were appointed a committee to confer with the railroad officials and take such other steps as may be necessary to secure results.

It is understood that the new railway rate bill provides that the railroads shall establish at least one terminal point in each state. If this is the case Las Vegas is the logical Nevada terminal on the Salt Lake route.

The meeting appointed C. P. Squires, A. N. Pauff and A. Levy, a committee to confer with the railroad in regard to an artesian well.

A resolution was adopted to the effect that the county political conventions be requested to incorporate in their platforms a plank advocating the reduction of freight rates in Nevada.

Dowry Mildew of the Grape.
The downy mildew is the most destructive disease of the grape. It attacks all parts of the vines at ground. Pale brownish spots are upon their upper surfaces, while their lower surfaces grey downy patches appear. These patches are produced by outgrowths of the branched filaments from the breath pores. On the ends of these branched filaments are oval shaped spores borne. These spores carry the disease to other plants. Later in the year
