THE CONVENTION

(Continued from Page One)

PLATFORM

The Republicans of Lincoln county, in convention assembled, reaffirm their allegiance to the Republican party, and endorse the platform adopted by the State convention held at Tonopah, Nev., on the 4th day of September, 1906.

We believe that owing to the increased valuation of property and population of Lincoln county, that the salaries of the officers thereof are entirely inadequate to enable them to perform in a proper and fitting manner the full and efficient duties thereof.

We believe that the laborer is worthy of his hire, and that the county in its present condition is able to pay such compensation for services rendered by its officers as to make it an incentive for fit and competent persons to aspire to its offices, and to this end we pledge the Legislative nominees of this convention.

We favor the refunding of the existing indebtedness of Lincoln county by the issuance of bonds upon a just and equitable basis to the taxpayers of the county.

H. M. Lillis, assuming the office of permanent chairman, the convention proceeded with the nomination of candidates, as appears below:

Before adjourning the convention elected the present county central committee for the ensuing two years, by the same vote that nominated most of the candidates.

Upon motion of W. T. Roberts a vote of thanks was extended to the citizens of Las Vegas for their entertainment of the convention and especially to the ladies for the splendid decorations, which lent a cheerful aspect to the big barn-like structure.

Wm. J. Stewart moved that proxies be prohibited in future conventions and the motion carried.

The convention adjourned sine die.

After all, Las Vegas was given one important nomination—that of Assemblyman. In W. R. Thomas the party presents a strong candidate. He is a successful man of affairs, free from all untoward influences, and will fight for the best interests of Lincoln county.

The sheriff bug-a-boo was a foun-flush. Las Vegas staked all on the hand and lost.

Searchlight, Las Vegas and Caliente are the three largest voting precincts in the county, and containing over one-half the population, could not control the convention. Dissatisfaction prevails and good Democratic candidates will receive a large Republican vote.

Las Vegas, the largest town in the county, will ask the Democratic convention for a commissioner.

Muddy River delegates voted with the north end of the county in order to get recognition, but are in sympathy with the interests of the south. Different management would have brought them into line with Las Vegas and Searchlight.
