**Brutal Assault**

M., by means of a dam, and two (2) cubic feet per second is to be conveyed to points in the northeast 1/4 of Section 4, T. 21 S., R. 61 E., M. D. M., by means of a flume and ditch, and there used for irrigation purposes. The construction of said works shall begin before February 1, 1907, and shall be completed on or before February 1, 1908. The water shall be actually applied to a beneficial use on or before February 1, 1909.
