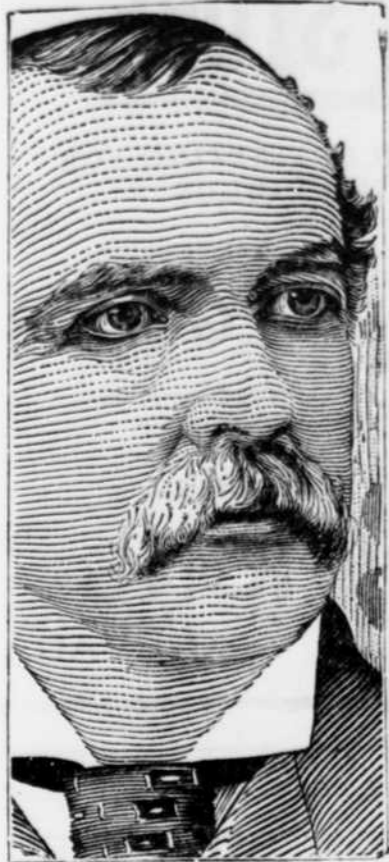


UNITED STATES SENATOR FROM SOUTH CAROLINA PRAISES PE-RU-NA.

Chrysanthemum Show in Los Angeles.

The coming Chrysanthemum Show to be given in Blanchard Hall, beginning the evening of October 31st and continuing three days, will prove of vital interest to the residents of Southern California.

There is probably no location possible for tourists to reach that is more adapted to the cultivation of plants and flowers than is this country. Some years ago it was hard to find a nurseryman who could make a livelihood by raising flowers, but today in Southern California there are over one hundred men most skilled in this line that can be found anywhere, and the products of their endeavors will be shown in a great measure at the coming exhibition in Los Angeles.

Not only will chrysanthemums be shown of every kind and color, but also palms and ferns, rare and beautiful flowers, and a special display of foliage plants.

One of the interesting features of this show will be the voting coupons which will be given to everyone entering the hall. They may then select that exhibit which in their judgment is best and most pleasing and they will have an opportunity to vote for their choice upon leaving the hall. This will give a stimulus as well as encouragement to the growers.

Both Blanchard and Symphony Halls have been engaged for this exhibition and one ticket admits to both exhibits.

When a Person is Half Drowned.
After a person, practically drowned, has been brought to a place of safety, directly on reaching shore loosen all clothing on the rescued one, no matter if the clothing amounts to no more than a bathing suit. If you have some one to assist you, all the better. Lift the victim and hold him head down, shaking the body gently. This will start the water in the lungs flowing out of the water. Act quickly. When the flow of water ceases lay the person on his back and see to it that the tongue is well forward in the mouth. Take a towel or handkerchief and wipe away any mucus or froth, place a support under the shoulders sufficient to elevate that part of the body so that the head will tilt back. This will help to clear the throat. Then begin artificial respiration.—Philadelphia Press.
