## PROCLAMATION

### State, County and National Officers, Elected Nov. 6

Whereas, on the 6th day of November, A. D. 1906, a general election was held in the State of Nevada for a Governor, a Lieutenant-Governor, a member of the house of Representatives of the United States, a Justice of the Supreme Court, a District Judge for the First, Third and Fourth Judicial Districts, two District Judges for the Second Judicial District, a Secretary of State, a State Treasurer, a State Controller, an Attorney-General, a Surveyor-General, a State Superintendent of Public Instruction, a Superintendent of State Printing, two Regents of the state University (long term), and two Regents of the State University (short term); and

Whereas, on the third Monday of December succeeding such election, to wit, December 17, 1906, the Justices of the Supreme Court met at the office of the Secretary of State as a Board of Canvassers, and opened and canvassed the vote for the aforementioned officers; and

Whereas, The certificate of said Board of Canvassers of the State of Nevada is now on file in said office of the Secretary of State; now, therefore,

In pursuance of and in obedience to the laws of the state of Nevada, in such case made and provided, I, John Sparks, Governor, do hereby proclaim that the following named persons, at said election, received the highest number of votes cast for the offices respectively as hereinafter specified, and that therefore they are duly elected to said offices, with a right to hold and enjoy all and singular the powers and privileges thereof, to wit:
