### Agatized Forest

In Charleston Mountains Prof. Bachtelle has located a deposit of agatized wood. A fine specimen was brought in this week to be forwarded to Yale University. A larger shipment will soon be made to the Rock Island Railroad Co., for exhibition in their foreign offices.  
 Prof. Bachtelle states that this agatized wood will admit of as fine a polish as any that has been found in the famous petrified forests of Arizona.  
 In the vicinity of this deposit is found the petrified mastodon bones, of which mention was recently made in The Age. Both are relics of the same prehistoric age.
