CIMA MINES

Native Silver Strike by D. V. M. & M. Co.

A sensational strike is reported at 110 feet depth in the shaft of the Death Valley Mining and Milling Company near Cima, California. The ore shows native wire silver in small cavities and carries some galena. It is sugary quartz and well mineralized.

These claims were located in May, 1906, by Mr. B. N. Dawson, of Denver, because of a discovery of high grade ore in prominent croppings. Development was started and has reached to 110 feet depth, on the incline. Drifts have been run out from the 100-foot station east and west for 125 feet and 100 feet.

On the Mollie Gibson claim of the Greenwater Consolidated Mining Company, of Los Angeles, a second discovery of high grade silver ore carrying gold has been made on what is thought to be the same vein, some 5000 feet southwest of the Dawson shaft. The management is now sinking a prospect shaft where high grade ore was discovered.

Much money is now going into the development of prospects in this vicinity, which is today among the most promising mining sections of the southwest.

Break Jail

COPPER

Phenomenal Specimens Come From Near Cima

Considerable excitement has been caused by marvelously rich specimens of copper ore reported to have been sent in from near Cima by P. H. McCarty, a prospector well known in Las Vegas.

Smith & Hecker, the assayers, who have been doing considerable work for McCarty, did not feel at liberty to give The Age any information for publication, but expect to be able to do so in a few days.

The find was made not far from Cima, where the Death Valley M. & M. Co. has just encountered native silver in its shaft. It is stated that the copper specimens sent in by McCarty surpass anything yet produced by Nevada or California copper camps.

RICH ORE

Assays From Quo Vadis Show Great Values

Recent assays from the Quo Vadis mine in the Vincent district have surprised even those who have been interested in the property for months.

A. J. Frye, who is now in charge of the work at the mine, after many test assays, states that there is in sight four tons of ore that will go better than \$3,000 per ton.

Representative Williams Leaves Mines to Legislate

Searchlight Bulletin: Representative Frank Williams has suspended work temporarily on the Shreveport and left for Carson City to attend to legislative duties. Mr. Williams intends to incorporate his holdings in the Crescent district and develop the Shreveport group. The vein pans freely and is a free milling ore.

The Searchlight Gold Extraction Co. increased the working force on the Jumbo shaft last week. The shaft is to be sunk 100 feet, when levels will be driven on the vein.

Dr. Harris and Johnson are preparing to prosecute work on the Buckhorn group, adjoining the Golden Crescent Co. property. Values have already been found up to \$200 in gold per ton.

At Crescent some five miles of wire have been strung connecting the different mines and places of business.

ELDORADO

Telephone Extension--News of the Mines

The Searchlight Western Telephone Co. is extending its line from the Wall Street mine at Eldorado Canyon on down to the town of Nelson.

A new company to be known as the Evans Eldorado Mining and Milling Co. has been organized to develop a group of ten claims at Eldorado Canyon lying north of the Wall Street. The company is incorporated under the laws of Arizona for \$1,000,000 and its officers are: W. B. Atwell, president; W. D. Haynes, vice-president, and J. M. Evans, secretary and treasurer.—Searchlight Bulletin.

Sullivan Failure

San Francisco mining stock brokers, creditors of the L. M. Sullivan Trust Company of Goldfield, ratified the agreement arrived at to accept dollar for dollar in stocks to be placed in escrow as security for payment of their claims in 60, 90 and 150 days. It was learned that the Sullivan Company is indebted to San Francisco brokers to the amount of \$225,000 and to the State Bank & Trust Company of Goldfield for \$300,000.

Tax List Blunder

The Caliente Lode Express, which obtained the printing of the delinquent tax list on a LOW bid, has been advertising the sale to take place January 13th, when it does not occur till January 21st.

The Age does not know whether the blunder is the result of a clerical error or of awarding the printing to a cheap bidder.

"16" For Railroad Men

The senate on January 10 by a vote of 70 to 1 passed the bill limiting the continuous hours of labor of an employee on a railroad to sixteen hours. The bill specifies that the men shall have at least ten hours rest between shifts.

Goldfield Strike Settled

By a vote of 1293 to 554 in favor of accepting the proposition of \$5 a day for miners and skilled help, and \$4.50 for laborers, the Miner's Union and I. W. W. of Goldfield ended the strike Thursday of last week that has been on at that place for several weeks.

DRY FARMING

Settlers Locate in Piute Valley Near Searchlight

While Las Vegas is making efforts to secure artesian water, Searchlight in the absence of the same is planning to go dry.

Searchlight Bulletin says: H. M. Benson arrived Sunday in company with ten more men, mostly farmers, who expect to be members of the new agricultural community that he is establishing in Piute Valley west of this place.

These men are going into the waste places, so called, and are going to smite the ground and make water to flow, harry the serpent from his rock pile, and cause fruits and grains to grow.

They hail from Huntington Beach, Westminster, Santa Ana and Orange, just over the range. They observe here approximately the same phenomena of soil, climate and sheltering and moisture precipitating mountain range.

At a point eleven miles west of Searchlight, and on the talked of extension of the Salt Lake Railroad from Nipton, 160 acres is about to be platted for a townsite. A 500 foot well will be sunk with a view of developing artesian water, and many other improvements made.

Price of Fuel

Wood is now selling in Las Vegas at \$12.00 for about two-thirds of a cord.

Peter Buol is sending large quantities of wood from Vegas to Bullfrog district where it brings \$35.00 per load or short cord.

Coal is unobtainable at any price. Station agent Ubil asserts that many Salt Lake refrigerator trains have been delayed on account of the coal shortage.
