### Equipment for Salt Lake

The Salt Lake railway is about to appropriate more than \$500,000 for new equipment.

The Salt Lake railway has been using every pound of power it had.

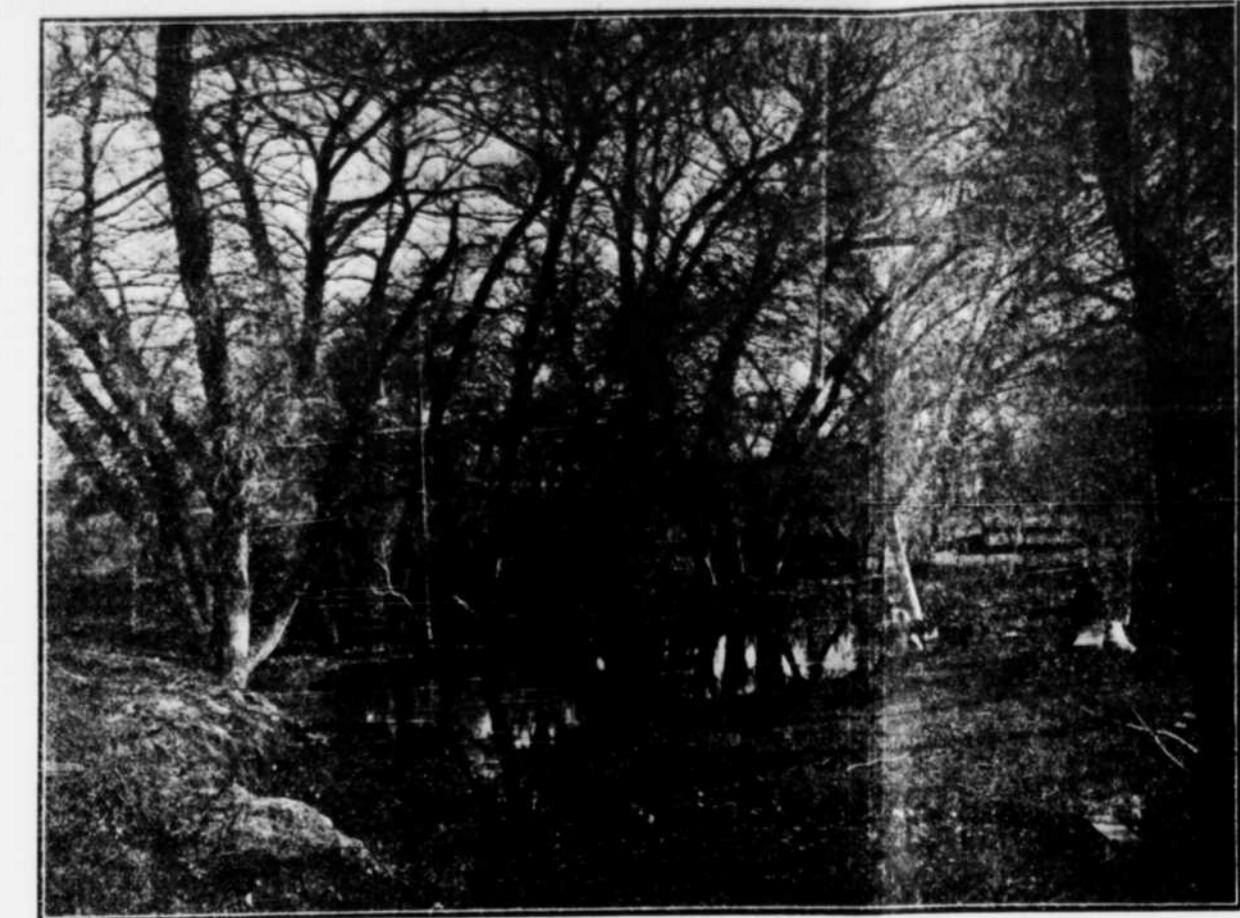
