## LINCOLN COUNTY MINES

Ore is Now Being Shipped from DeLamar, Pioche, Moapa, Las Vegas, Crescent, Good Springs, Searchlight and Other Points

Following up its article of January 26, showing Lincoln county a leader in the actual production and shipment of ore, The Age is making a systematic canvass to ascertain the exact amounts being shipped from the various localities.

In Good Springs or Yellow Pine district one company shipped 14 cars of copper ore during the month of September. Smaller ore shipments are constantly being made by many companies.

Four companies have already shipped ore from the Crescent district. The Age is gathering figures on Lincoln county production and will shortly publish them.

They will probably surprise the natives and the boom camps of other sections.

## GOOD SPRINGS

Ore Shipping and Development in Yellow Pine

S. E. Yount furnishes The Age with the following news of Yellow Pine district.

Shennandoa mine, owned by J. W. Burton, Wm. M. O'Brien and Samuel Newhouse of Salt Lake, has shipped something like 8 or 10 cars of lead and silver ore to Salt Lake smelters.

Hoosier mine owned by Harry Joseph, J. Oberlander and others of Salt Lake, has shipped 8 cars lead ore to Salt Lake smelters.

Yellow Pine Mining Co. shipped one car lead and one of copper ore from their property as a test. They have enough in sight to load a train a day of lead and zinc ore for some time. There has never been a pound of waste taken out of this mine.

99 mine, owned by C. M. Over, shipped 6 cars copper ore.

The Toledo mine owned by Los Angeles parties have several cars of fine lead ore on their dump ready for shipment as soon as packers can be secured to get it off the hill.

Judge Ross, J. H. Call and others who own the Accident and Bullion mines, are preparing to do some shipping of lead ores.

The Mountain Top mine group of claims under bond from the Campbell estate by Bond people and under the management of Chas. E. McCarthy, has a force of men at work piling up quantities of high grade lead-silver ores. They will not ship until they install a tramway to get ore down off the hill.

The Lavina owned by H. Hordy and C. H. Scheu of Salt Lake City, have a force of men developing this property which is a gold proposition.

D. MacVicker of Salt Lake has been here this week looking over some property which he considers favorable.

C. H. Scheu has a force of men on the Iron Gold Mine developing it.

The Keystone is running a good force on the mine and the mill is turning out monthly shipments of gold bullion. This mine, has produced something over \$2,000,000.00.

The Red Cloud mine is shut down for the present on account of freezing weather, as it is impossible to operate their cyanide plant.

Robbins Bros of Utah have a force of men on their property and are sacking ore for shipment. There will be more ore shipped in the next two months than the previous two months.

The Columbia Mining Co. shipped 14 cars copper ore during the month of Sept., 1906, and now are planning to erect a smelter to handle their ore.

The Potosi belongs to this district which as every one knows, is shipping ore daily.

## SUNSET

Miners Hold Meeting and Form District

A letter to The Age from Sunset camp, near Lyons, dated Jan 25th, says:

A regularly advertised miner's meeting was held here this afternoon called to order by Lawyer Dick Busted. Lee Bright, original locator of the camp, was elected presiding officer and Sam Martin secretary. The camp and district was duly christened the Sunset Mining District of Nevada.

A committee of five consisting of Mr. Jack Burns of the "Lucy Gray", Messrs Martin, Aufelbaugh, Bail and West, was appointed to draw rules and regulations to be submitted to an adjourned meeting for adoption. Richard Busted was unanimously elected as District Recorder.

The "Lucy Gray" through its manager Jack Burns, has let a contract to Mr. Bob Ferguson of Las Vegas for the construction of a wagon road from the camp to the main shaft of the mine.

A petition for the establishment of a Post Office was put into circulation at the miner's meeting and received nearly forty signatures.

The camp looks exceedingly lively; outside capitalists and investors are frequent visitors.

The "Lucy Gray" has demonstrated itself to be one of the great mines of the world. The owners have ordered a mill and other machinery and a large force of men will soon be at work.

The contract for a two hundred foot shaft just below the Sunset Townsite has been let and work will be started in a few days.

Some rich specimens of copper ore are being brought into camp, especially by Dave Bail and the Martin Bros.

Mr. E. S. Adams the well known mining engineer and geologist who spent about two weeks in camp, is arranging for displays in New York and Boston of samples from the various properties in the district.
