GEOLOGICAL

Greatest Extremes Above and Below Sea Level

During the past year U. S. Geological survey parties, under R. H. Chapman and L. F. Biggs have been establishing elevations and placing monuments in the deserts of Southern Nevada and California.

According to the metallic monument behind the bank pillar, on the right at the postoffice entrance, Las Vegas is 2024 feet above the sea.

The greatest depth of Death Valley below sea level is 276 feet, near Bennett's well.

Strangely enough the highest point in the United States is Mount Whitney, Southern California, only 75 miles from the lowest in Death Valley. Whitney towers 14,500 feet above sea level. Before the Salton Sink was flooded by the Colorado river, it contained the lowest point of dry land in the United States, a spot 287 feet below sea level.

CIMA MINES

Silver and Lead South of Las Vegas in California

A strike of importance is reported as having been made this week in the main shaft of the Death Valley Gold Mining and Milling company of Cima, San Bernardino county, California.

At 135 feet depth on the incline, high grade silver lead ore was broken into. This filled the shaft and a letter from the superintendent states that subsequent work towards the foot wall has shown the ore body to be eight feet wide. The ore carries much galena and free silver.

From near the surface this shaft has been in ore averaging about \$40 to the ton. Six carloads, taken from the shaft and a short drift, have been shipped to Salt Lake City. A seventh car is now being loaded.

On the extension of the Death Valley vein, in the Sterling Silver Claim, the Greenwater Consolidated Mining Company has struck high-grade silver-lead ore in two shafts, 150 feet apart.

A new camp is rapidly growing up at this place, which has been named Camp Dawson. Forty-five men are now employed. The three companies operating are energetically managed. L. A. Mining Review.

MINING PROFITS

Legitimate Enterprises in America Pay Big Dividends

In 1906 the dividends declared by 156 companies operating in the United States, Mexico, Canada and Central and South America, as tabulated by the Mining World, amounted to the large total of \$105,197,755. Since their incorporation these concerns have distributed profits of \$574,692,971.

There were 113 gold, silver and lead mines and works that paid dividends of \$42,406,164 in 1906, making their total since incorporation \$232,455,530. The largest dividend payers today are the ore treatment works. The American Smelting and Refining Company, known as the smelter trust, capitalized at \$100,000,000, paid 7 per cent, on both its common and preferred stock in 1906, the combined dividend being \$7,000,000, and making the total since 1899 \$21,331,553.

The largest dividend-paying gold mine on the American continent in 1906 was the Esperanza in Mexico, which declared \$3,508,050 on a capital of \$2,275,000, making its total since incorporation \$34,347,525.

The copper mines stand at the head of the dividend list, thirty-two properties reporting \$60,742,345 in 1906, which makes \$330,591,920 since their incorporation. The largest amount paid in 1906 was \$10,716,153 by the Amalgamated Copper Company, making its total since incorporation, in 1899, \$43,417,230.

One of the most important of these properties is the Boston and Montana, which although capitalized at only \$3,750,000, has paid dividends of \$7,200,000 in 1906, making a total of \$50,725,000 (1353 per cent.) since incorporation, in 1887. The last quarterly dividend of this company was \$12 per share, being at the rate of 184 per cent, per annum on the capitalization. Anaconda, another Amalgamated offspring, paid dividends of \$4,050,000 on \$30,000,000 capital in 1906, and since organization under Montana laws in 1895, it has declared \$30,900,000. North Butte paid \$3,950,000 in 1906, making \$4,400,000 (nearly 49 per cent.) since incorporation on \$9,000,000 issued capital.

The Lake copper mines have distributed large dividends during the year. Calumet and Hecla, with a capitalization of only \$2,500,000 paid dividends of \$7,000,000 in 1906, which makes a total since incorporation, in 1871, of \$99,350,000, or 3974 per cent.

In Mexico, the Greene Consolidated Copper Company is the largest dividend payer in its class; in 1906 it declared \$1,891,200, making a total of \$5,537,800 since 1899. The present outstanding capital of this company is \$10,000,000 while the market value of the property on December 31, 1906, was \$33,000,000. Other large dividend-paying copper mines are situated in Arizona, Utah, Tennessee, California, Wyoming and British Columbia.

Nine zinc properties paid dividends of \$1,414,404 in 1906, making a total since their incorporation of \$10,231,669. The largest amount has been declared by the New Jersey Zinc Company, which is capitalized at \$10,000,000; its dividend in 1906 was \$1,200,000, making a total of \$9,600,000 to date. Five zinc companies in Wisconsin and three in Missouri and Kansas reported dividends in 1906. One nickel company, the International, known as the trust, paid \$534,752 in dividends on its \$8,912 preferred stock.

One California quicksilver mine, the Idria, declared a dividend of \$100,000 in 1906, making \$880,000 to date on its capitalization of \$500,000.

Strike at Butte

At Butte, Montana, the Miners Union has voted for an increase of wages of underground men from \$3.75 to \$4 and for shaft men from \$4.25 to \$4.50 per day by a vote of 2349 for to 1068 against, the increased rate to go into effect May 1.

Development work was ordered stopped at all of the Amalgamated properties, and about 2000 men engaged in such work were laid off.
