# TWO ARE KILLED

## Falling Crane Crushes Out Lives of Two Salt Lake Railroad Employes at Washout Near Afton Station

### DR. H. L. HEWETSON INJURED

Last Monday two men were killed and one injured by the upsetting of a hoisting crane on the Salt Lake railroad, at the Mojave river crossing near Afton. The dead are:

THOMAS T. DONALDSON, stationery engineer of the hoisting crane, a resident of Las Vegas.

L. M. NASH, station agent if the Salt Lake road at Otis.

Roadmaster Henry Olsen of the Los Angeles division sustained a fractured arm.

The crane was engaged in hoisting heavy rock from flat cars to repair the washout, when, through either misoperation or structural weakness, it became unbalanced and fell.

A telegram announcing Donaldson's death was sent to Las Vegas and Mrs. D. D. Hickey was finally selected to break the sad news to Mrs. Donaldson, who was so shocked and dazed by the intelligence that she seemed scarcely to realize its import. She left on the first train for the scene of the accident.

Peculiarly sad is the death of young Nash. He was married to Miss Russel, of Riverside, less than six months ago, and his young wife was making her home with him at Otis. Mrs. Nash is only 19 years of age. She and the deceased had planned a visit to their Riverside relatives Sunday.

John Feeney, former road master, will supercede temporarily the injured roadmaster.

#### SURGEON BREAKS LEG

Surgeon H. L. Hewetson of the Salt Lake road, while on duty in Meadow Valley canyon, broke a bone in his leg last Saturday night by jumping the track with a gasoline "speeder."

The doctor set the fracture himself before being brought to Las Vegas, from where he was accompanied to Los Angeles by Dr. Roy W.
