KILLED AND INJURED

Reports from Colton state that 25 were killed and 100 injured in a wreck on the Southern Pacific. The overland collided with a freight because of a misplaced switch. Is there no remedy for this epidemic of railroad slaughter?

Punish Negligence

At Los Angeles the Santa Fe conductor and fireman in charge of the train that killed and injured a lot of students on another train, last week, have been arrested and must stand trial for manslaughter. Railroads are not always at fault in accidents. Sometimes men in charge of trains are drunk or careless; and in such cases should be held strictly responsible, as a lesson to others. To avoid loss of life greater efficiency and judgement must be cultivated in train service.

Arizona Mines

Bisbee mines have adopted a new scale raising the wages of miners from \$3.75 to \$4.00 per day and adding twenty-five cents to every man connected with the operation of the mines who heretofore has been receiving as much as \$3.50 per day. The increase also extends to the men in the smelters at Douglas.

Nevada's Population 60,000

According to the first census taken in Nevada, that of 1870, the State then had a population of 42,491, which in 1880 had increased to 62,296. In 1890 the population had decreased to 41,761, and in 1900 to 41,325, which was less than in 1870.

As the inhabitants of the State have not been enumerated since the census of 1900, which was prior to the mining revival, the present population of Nevada is an unknown quantity. According to the census of 1900 the population of Nevada was 41,325. The total vote for presidential electors that year was 10,196 about one vote for every four inhabitants. In 1906 the total vote for Governor was 14,837, which on the basis of 1900 would indicate a population of about 59,000. A fair estimate gives Las Vegas 1000 population.
