GOLD BUTTE

Mines Developing in Eastern Part of Lincoln County

There is a great deal of activity at Gold Butte and Copper City. The following Co's are pushing development work fast with very good showings.

Lincoln Copper Co., Cobb Bros., The Copper City Mining, Mercantile & Townsite Co., The Granite Nevada Gold Mines Co., The Finance Mines Co., The Cedar Basin Gold Mining Co., The Southern Nevada Copper Co., The American Mica Co., The Nevada Gold Butte Co., and Kimberly Nevada Mining Co.

There is a store, saloon and hotel in Copper City. The last few days there are over 90 miners in the latter camp.

At Gold Butte the Granite Nevada Gold Mines Co. are operating a mercantile store in connection with the post office and will erect a new building within the next 60 days and increase the mercantile stock. They are also handling lots in the Gold Butte Townsite and some are already disposed of.

With every arrival of the stages from Moapa and St. Thomas the population of Gold Butte increases.

A notice is posted for a general meeting for the purpose of forming a new mining district to be known as Gold Butte Mining District.

Lower Muddy Valley

Frank French and C. A. French left Las Vegas Monday for Cedar Basin, Gold Butte and Grand Gulch, on a prospecting tour. They went by wagon via Moapa, but could have saved half the travel had a road existed directly east from Las Vegas, sixty miles. A wagon road should be built direct from this town to the new mining country, which is rapidly coming to the front.

MANUFACTURING

Plaster Mill to be Erected Near Las Vegas

Two and one-half miles south of Arden, on the Salt Lake road, the Alpine Plaster Co. of Los Angeles announces, will soon be commenced the erection of a big mill for the manufacture of plasters of all kinds.

W. R. Moore, superintendent of the company was in Las Vegas this week, and states that work on the factory will be commenced as soon as a spur track can be put in.

The plant will have a capacity of 150 tons each 24 hours, and will employ from 25 to 30 men.

The gypsum deposits are only four and one-half miles from the mill site and water will be obtained from the Cottonwood Springs pipe line.

Mr. Moore also states that the company is experimenting with a fibre machine to handle the native Joshua trees. This, if successful, will give employment to additional men.

Nevada Scenery

While prospecting near St. Thomas recently Frank French and Thomas found a great dyke into which they dug for a distance of five miles. At every opening they found what appeared to be large petrified trees.

Further up the Grand Canyon of the Colorado river they found a narrow canyon over 6000 feet deep, so dark at the bottom that the stars could be seen shining in midday.

POTOSI MINES

About 100 Cars of Lead and Zinc Awaiting Shipment

Potosi mine, near Las Vegas, is one of the old reliable shippers. Nearly 100 cars of ore are loaded ready for passage to the eastern smelter on completion of the Salt Lake smelter. This lead and zinc ore, shipped out regularly, marks the old Potosi as one of the real mines.

An Old Mine

J. R. Hunter was in Vegas Wednesday from the old Excelsior mine in Charleston Range, now owned by Hunter & Hawkins. From 1870 to 1876 it was worked by the old school miners for silver, but now produces silver and zinc. In the pioneer days two shafts about 100 feet each were sunk, and the ore was hauled to Los Angeles by wagon. They have 20 tons of zinc ore on the dump.

Senator Clark's Bath

It is not often that the Age makes the bath of even an eminent citizen the subject of comment, but Senator Clark had one last week remarkable in some respects. On his way west he stopped in Colorado to examine some of his coal mines. Crossing a stream on the ice his carriage broke through and he got an involuntary bath. He was rescued by friends, but had a narrow escape from floating under the ice.

Senator Clark is now in Los Angeles, said to be in session with Harriman's representative, devising plans to make the Salt Lake Route what it should be. The grade through Meadow Valley Wash must be raised above the freshest level.

Copper and Galena

Fifty miles west of Las Vegas in the Arrow range, Messrs C. T. Pine, J. A. Robson and John Russell are developing a promising copper and galena ledge.

They have an incline tunnel in 100 feet and will shortly install track and car to remove the ore.

A specimen brought in by Mr. Pine this week went 20 per cent copper with some silver, showing a total value of \$104.60 per ton. Much of the ore runs high in galena and a quantity of shipping grade is now on the dump.

Railroad Law Recently Passed Ignores Passenger Rates
