LAS VEGAS VALLEY

Great Resources and Possibilities Under Artesian Water System

Up to the northwest from Las Vegas, on the S. P., L. A. & S. L. R. R. (Salt Lake Route) in Lincoln County, Nevada, stretches a valley varying in width from a few hundred feet to thirty miles.

This ancient river valley rises in the northwest and runs to the southeast passing Tonopah, Goldfield, Bullfrog, Las Vegas, and unites with the Colorado river, at the big bend to the south, 25 miles east of Las Vegas.

A Telegram says Thaw Has Been Acquitted

GRAND GULCH

Shipping Mines, Oil Fields and Projected Railroad

The Copper City country near Gold Butte, is improving every day, many new strikes have been made the past week. Copper is being uncovered at many places within a radius of five miles of the "Lincoln" group, which has changed hands for cash at a good round figure.

Two stores have gone into this district within the last ten days. Prospectors and mining men are going into Copper City every day. O. J. Sanbury and Dr. Bracken passed through this place two or three days ago enroute to the new Eldorado.

Teams continue hauling ore from the Grand Gulch daily, where one ton of ore is hauled for shipment, ten tons are blocked out in the mine.

Mr. Lawrence Harris is making arrangements to begin shipping from the Savanic. This mine has 150 tons of ore now on the dump awaiting shipment.

The finance Co. is also making arrangements to ship its first car of ore. This mine is down only about 100 feet.

Between the oil fields on the Rio Virgin and the mining strikes at Copper City the two Stage lines are finding plenty of traffic these days.

Mr. J. F. Miller from Las Vegas spent a day last week in Moapa, having missed the stage. He got off on last Friday's Stage for the oil regions.

Mr. Walter Jennings passed through here last week. He seems to feel confident the Moapa and Grand Gulch railroad will be built. This is the road for which a charter was recently granted by act of the Legislature to Hampton George, Walter Jennings and Harry Gentry. While the holders do not say so in that many words everyone in this section is satisfied that the Clark interests are backing this project.

Timber Settlement

Lincoln County Lumber Company, with a saw mill on Charleston mountain, is about to make settlement with the Government for lumber cut on the reserve. It will be made on the basis of \$10.00 per 1000, and amount to about \$12,000.

Others have settlements coming also on the same basis.
