The Copper City country near Gold Butte, is improving every day, many new strikes have been made the past week. Copper is being uncovered at many places within a radius of five miles of the "Lincoln" group, which has changed hands for eash at a good round figure.

Two stores have gone into this district within the last ten days. Prospectors and mining men are going into 3,925 35 Copper City every day. O. J. Saulisbury and Dr. Bracken passe! through this place two or three days ago enronte to the new Eldorado.

Teams continue hauling ore from the Grand Gulch daily, where one ton of ore is hauled for shipment, ten tons are blocked out in the mine.
