Official Minutes of the April Session

Clerk's Office April 1st 1907. The Board of County Commissioners of Lincoln County Nevada met pursuant to adjournment, Monday April 1st 1907 at 10 o'clock a. m.

Present J. A. Nesbitt, chairman, Geo T. Banovich, member, Chas. Lee Horsey, Dist. Attorney and William E. Orr, clerk.

The minutes of the March meeting were read and approved.

Quarterly and monthly reports of the various county officers were read and approved.

Salary and general county bills allowed as per Register Claim Book.

Claim of Mrs. E. Berninger was ordered returned to be made out in the form of a bill and to be sworn to.

Bill of Geo. C. Fetterman for the sum of \$35.00 was ordered returned for itemization.

Bill of J. S. Denton for the sum of \$22.50 was reduced to \$16.00 for the reason that the difference should be paid by the sheriff.

Bill of J. A. Denton for the sum of \$25.00 was ordered returned for proper itemization.

Bill of the Panaca Co-operative for the sum of \$41.00 was reduced to \$36.00.

Two bills of Dr. J. West Smith for the sum of \$15.00 each were reduced to 5.00 each.

Bill of J. W. Smith for the sum of \$10 was disallowed.

It was ordered by the Board that Jas. A. Nesbitt, chairman of the Board be appointed and authorized to approve the plot of the Bunkerville-Panaca Townsite.

The petition of Oscar Rowland for an engineer's license was ordered laid over until such time as he present proper credentials of his ability.

The application of R. N. Corvan for an engineer's license was granted.

The application of D. O. Varnir for a stationery engineer's license was granted.

An application from Roy Orr for a stationery engineer's license was granted.

Application of Blake Earls for a stationery engineer's license was denied for the reason that said application was not accompanied with proper credentials.

The Bond of H. W. Turner as Justice of the Peace of Delamar Township was approved.

A petition was received from the residents of Spring Valley road district asking for the sum of \$100.00 for the purpose of repairing the county road.

It was ordered that the sum be allowed out of the General Fund of the county.

J. C. Healy appeared before the Board on behalf of C. W. Garrison and asked permission to use the office immediately facing the treasurer's office as an office for the Justice of the Peace. It was ordered that such permission be granted.

In response to the advertisements for bids for the construction of a bridge over the wash near Caliente, a bid was received from Chris Ammon of Caliente. It appearing to the Board from statements made by citizens of Caliente that the ford now being constructed would serve the purpose of all travel, it was ordered that the letting of the contract for the construction of the bridge be postponed indefinitely.

Thereafter the Board proceeded to check up the funds and found the same to be correct.

The board then adjourned until Monday May 6th, 1907, at 10 o'clock a. m.

Great Zinc, Lead and Copper Deposits Under Development

Editor Las Vegas Age: Upon my return to Good Springs, after an absence of nearly five months, I find many changes, and much that is new in a mining and industrial way.

The population of the district has almost doubled since last October.

The most pronounced and noticeable advances in mining have been made in zinc. The finding and opening up of this metal has become a veritable furor. From the Potosi to State line pass, a distance of twenty-five or thirty miles, zinc is being found everywhere.

It is interesting, at this time, to recall the romantic history of zinc in this camp. Surely nature intended no joke upon the prospectors of this camp. Zinc ore was left in plain sight on the surface, and great bodies of it were encountered in developing the different lead deposits.

We called it "casing" or "ledge matter," and contemptuously flung it over the dump. Occasionally, some one would have it assayed, for lead, and get nothing. As a result more contempt for the innocent looking stuff.

Finally, about a year ago, a young man, who didn't know any better, sent some of it away to be tried for zinc. It reminded him of something he had seen in Missouri. In due time he received a glowing assay certificate, showing a high percentage of that metal.

Everybody began assaying then, and, within a month we found that Good Springs was a veritable Golconda for zinc. We are at a disadvantage in one respect. There are no zinc smelters anywhere in the west. The ore has to be shipped to Kansas, and the high freight charge is almost prohibitive. We are promised reduction works here, pretty soon, and a company in San Francisco is preparing to treat such ores, too. It won't be long till Good Springs will have an opportunity to demonstrate its richness.

While zinc certainly attracts the most attention, I find that the lead and copper resources of this district are not being overlooked or neglected. Continuous shipments of these ores are being made. For many years, this camp has been a producer of gold though there isn't much doing in that line just now, owing to a disposition to neglect the opening up of new ore bodies while the old ones are being exhausted.

There are 4 gasoline hoists running in this camp, with two more on the road, and their owners impatiently awaiting the repair of the R. R. wash-outs.

With the exception of the Keystone mine, Good Springs is not a high grade camp. It doesn't produce sensational or "jewelry store" ore, like Goldfield or Wonder, but it has immense bodies of zinc, lead and copper, and promises to become a steady and heavy producer of these metals for generations to come.

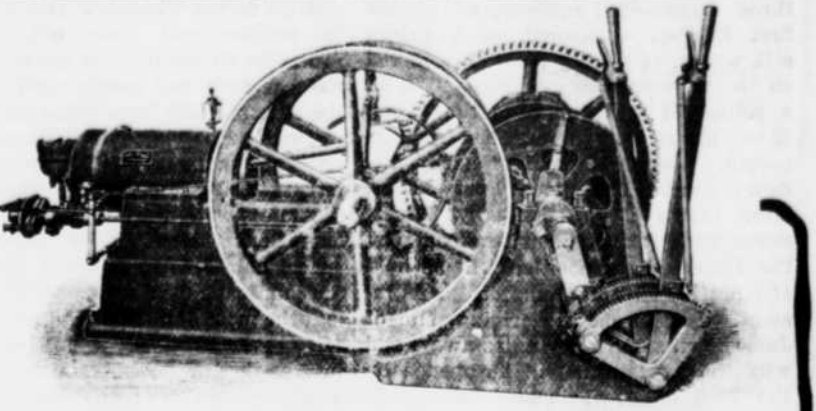
