

Railroad Pooling

According to Washington dispatches legal proceedings will be instituted against the Salt Lake as well as against the Southern Pacific as soon as evidence gathered by the interstate Commerce commission can be worked into shape for reference to the Department of Justice.

Fines of \$5,000 a day are provided for violations of the anti-pooling law. This makes about \$150,000 a month, or \$1,925,000 a year. As it is about two years since the Salt Lake line was opened for traffic, \$3,650,000 may be charged against the Salt Lake and a like amount against the Southern Pacific for the continuation of the agreement which has been proved to exist between the two lines. This would give the government \$7,300,000 in fines, which the people will probably back later on.

Licensed Crime

A deplorable feature of the Nevada liquor license law is that it permits irresponsible persons to maintain "joints" in places where police or other proper regulations are an unknown quantity.

Persons desiring to conduct a tavern, saloon or other place where liquors are sold, outside the sphere of influence of regularly constituted officers of the law, should be required to furnish either a satisfactory character certificate or a substantial cash bond, such bond to be forfeited upon the first trespass beyond the bounds of reason and decency.

There are too many "joints" in Nevada where the breeding of crime goes on unhindered.

Goldfield strike is still on and all the mines are closed. Stocks have naturally fallen in price.

Asbestos

Some excellent specimens of asbestos have been brought in from the Colorado river district, southeast of Las Vegas, recently. The vein is not large on the surface but the samples obtained are perfect in formation. An effort is being made to interest local capital to develop the prospect.

GOLD BUTTE

News of Development in Growing Camp Fifty Miles East of Las Vegas

Developments here during the last ten days have practically established the permanency of Gold Butte as the coming mining camp of southeastern Nevada. Demand for lots in the new townsite of Gold Butte on the property of the Granite Nevada Gold Mines Company, promising strikes on a number of claims; the arrival of a score or more of men operators in camp; the opening of a general merchandise store and the sale of the Cobb property for \$30,000 and \$40,000 in stock to U. L. Dylce Investment Company of Los Angeles. These are some of the facts indicative of a promising future for Gold Butte.

E. M. Culver, an insurance man of Los Angeles, engineered the Cobb deal and has signified the intention of the corporation he represents to open up the Cobb holding on a large scale. In conjunction with this transfer John R. Ward sold 21 claims located by him on and about Cobb mountain. Ward has retained but one claim. This, he calls "The Tramp Miner's Home" and he speaks of it as his "bonanza," to be opened up only after all details in connection with his sale have been completed.

F. F. Gunn of Moapa has purchased two lots in the Gold Butte townsite, close to the postoffice and will establish a store and saloon on the ground at once.

J. F. Gibbs, for the Nevada Gold Butte Mining Company, is receiving bids for the continuation of the 480 ft. tunnel into the Gold Butte mountain on top of which there is a blowout of high grade ore.

Nels Olsen and Alfred Casabon have just completed location work on 15 claims lying west of the Standard group of Rossam and Sharp. Max Katzenmeyer and Henry S. Tengvall are opening up several high grade

gold leads on six claims adjoining the above property.

The Southern Nevada Copper Mining Company, under the management of T. S. Coffee, is preparing to start work on its property—one of the most favorable copper prospects in the camp.

Dr. Bracken of Las Vegas and O. J. Salisbury of Salt Lake, with others, visited Gold Butte properties this week, driving into camp behind a spanking four.

John A. Swapp of Overton, and controller of the Copper Mountain property, is looking over the field here.

It is understood that work is to be commenced on the Gentry-Bonelli property, recently purchased by Jennings Brothers of Salt Lake, who are heavily interested in the Grand Gulch mine.

The shaft of the Finance Mining Company, on the Margeurite claim, has reached a depth of 100 feet, and shows a solid ore shoot in the bottom with both walls well defined and constituting the entire shaft. It is the intention to drift both ways on the ledge at once. This property is under the management of Hon. Levi Syphus, member of the Assembly from this county.

Harry Shipler, the well known photographer of Salt Lake, has been spending a fortnight in camp and will leave with many interesting plates of the booming district of Gold Butte. He, with his uncle Joseph E. Shipler, an old-time Colorado mining man, have started work on their property, three miles west of Gold Butte.

The Cedar Basin Gold Mining Company is taking the lead in the proving of Cedar Basin properties by sinking on their Crown group, C. M. Temple, formerly of the Salt Lake railroad, an owner in the above property has arrived.

April 24th is to be a big day in Gold Butte. Miners from all parts of the district will assemble to establish a new mining district and elect a recorder.

COUNTY FUNDS
Taxes Collected Readily Eaten Up By Expenses

During the past quarter, ending March 31, 1907, there was collected in Lincoln county, recorder's fees, \$2,139.65; clerk's fees and docket tax, \$229.75; sheriff fees, \$3.50; justice court fines, \$85.00; gaming licenses, \$4,559; general licenses, \$2,450.59; slot machine license, \$418.00; delinquent county taxes, 1906, \$1050.98; penalty and interest on delinquent taxes, \$110.95 advertising on delinquent taxes, \$214; delinquent poll taxes \$12; on H. J. Goodrich's bond, \$17.75; sale of county property, \$40; poll taxes collected by the assessor, \$804; state school money, first apportionment for 1907, \$6,743.43. A total of \$18,967.20 collected and a total of \$17,644.99 disbursed; the cash balance of the treasurer being \$56,290.36 on April 1st.
During the months of January, February and March, 1907, the license collections less all fees and percentages was \$8117.15, showing an increase of \$2,425.05 over the same period last year. — Record.
