As a producer of precious metals Nevada occupies a high place among the States and Territories of the Union. In value of gold product the State is outranked only by Colorado, Alaska and California, while its silver output gives it fifth place, Colorado, Montana, Utah and Idaho taking precedence. In 1906 according to statistics collect-

ed by the United States geological survey from producing mining companies, Nevada mines vielded \$10,470,704 in gold, an increase of \$5,200,885 over 1905. The unexpected heavy, output of the Goldfield mines was \$7,026,154, an increase of over \$5,000,000 over the pregold, an output not very different from that of 1905. Lincoln county furnished in the Searchlight and De Lamar only about \$50,000.

The silver output was 6,770,611 ounces to Ely to suppress him. an increase of 288,530 ounces, which is pretty evenly distributed over all the activity.
