The Bullion mine is now fully equipped and making regular shipments of lead ore.

All the leasers in the district are working and making shipments. With a reasonable advance in the price of zinc great activity would be apparent.

The Yellow Pine mine plans to reopen its big mill about September 1.

Mr. Fincher is enthusiastic over the future of Rochester camp and looks for much real mining activity there as capital is available to work the properties on a large scale.

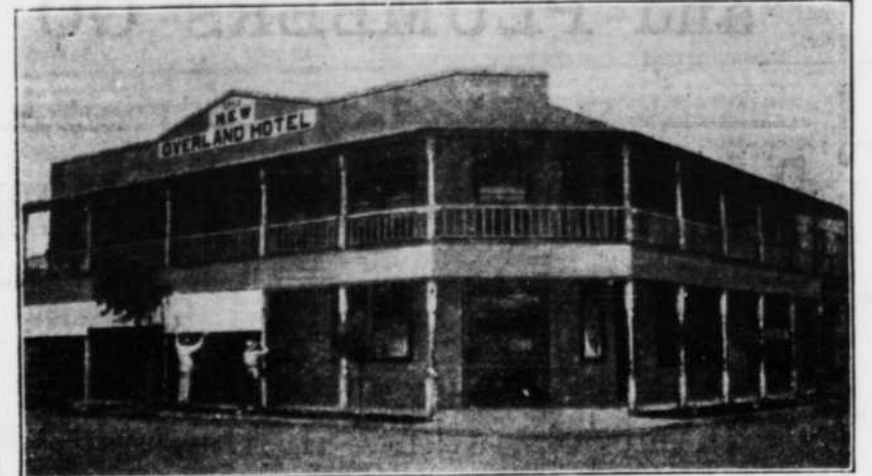
