The Nevada State Agricultural Society has made its annual report covering its transactions in connection with the state fair held at Reno last fall, at which the Silver Cup was awarded to Clark county for the best general county display of products. Now the regrettable part of it is that the report fails to make any mention of this, to us, important matter. However, W. D. Phillips, secretary of the society, has written E. W. Griffith, president of the Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce, in explanation of the matter as follows:

"Wish to say that we regret very much that this report makes no mention of the Silver Cup having been awarded to your county for the best general display of county products. In our president's letter the matter is very prominently referred to.

"The omission lays between either the state printer or myself. Am positive note was made of it but in the act of getting them all together this particular item may have become misplaced and caused the oversight.

"We regret exceedingly the omission occurred and it is our hope that you may take the pains to explain the matter satisfactorily to all of your good people who so generously participated and was a large factor in making our fair a success."
