Bank Will Aid You

With its characteristic spirit the First State Bank has announced that it will loan money for the purchase of Liberty Loan Bonds at 3 1/2 per cent interest, the amount to be repaid in installments. The purchaser is required to pay only 25 per cent of his bond purchase in cash.

When your bond comes to the bank, you pay the bank \$23 more. The bank then takes care of the balance, \$75, charging only 3 1/2 per cent interest and allowing you, to repay it in installments of \$7.50 per month. While you are making these payments your bond is drawing 3 1/2 per cent from the government and you are paying 3 1/2 per cent on what you owe the bank. When the bond is paid for you have something which is better than greenbacks or bank notes or gold or silver coin as it draws interest and can at the same time be circulated as freely as the money of the nation. Besides, by investing in a bond, many of us will save money which we would otherwise spend.
