THE COUNTY Officials who will look after the business of Clark County for the next two years slid into their places without a jolt on Monday. Of course this was to be expected in the cases of the Assessor, Clerk and Auditor and Recorder who succeeded themselves.

WILL HOLD EXAMINATION AT SEARCHLIGHT, NEVADA

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination to be held at Searchlight, Nevada, on January 25, 1919, as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourth-class postmaster at Nelson, Nevada, and other vacancies as they may occur at that postoffice, unless it shall be decided in the interest of the service to fill any vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$192 for the last fiscal year.

Applicants must have reached their twenty-first birthday on the date of the examination, with the exception that in a state where women are declared by statute to be of full age for all purposes at eighteen years, women eighteen years of age on the date of the examination will be admitted.

Applicants must reside within the territory supplied by the postoffice for which the examination is announced. The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who can comply with the requirements. Application blanks, Form 1753, and full information concerning the requirements of the examination can be secured from the postmaster at the place of vacancy or from the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C. Applications must be properly executed and filed with the Commission at Washington, D. C., at the earliest practicable date.
