WILL HOLD EXAMINATION

AT SEARCHLIGHT, NEVADA

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination to be held at Searchlight, Nevada, on January 25, 1919, as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourthclass postmaster at Nelson, Nevada, and other vacancies as they may occur at that postoffice, unless it shall be decided in the interest of the service to fill any vacancy by reinstatement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$192 for the last fiscal year.


