SINCE THE FULL number of street lights have been restored and the city sprinkling wagon is on the job every day Vegas seems quite metropolitan.

SPEAKING OF improvements, Las Vegas is one of the most civilized little cities in the state. But there are things still to be done. The most desirable improvement at the present time, and one which would not bear heavily on anyone, is an addition to our concrete sidewalks. For example, Bridger street should be completed from Main to Fifth, and Fourth street from Fremont to the high school building. This would connect the schools with the concrete walks leading to all parts of the city and keep the children out of the mud the coming winter. More important still, the new walks would add far more than their cost to the value of the property on those streets.

THE DEMOCRATIC press has been busy in attempting to convince the people that the Republican party is opposed to "A" League of Nations. The truth is that Republicans and Democrats alike would welcome a League of Nations so constructed that it would be able to hold in check those nations which would wage wars for their own enrichment or glory, and which would at the same time preserve to the United States her well won right to manage her own affairs and leave her free from the entanglements of Old World politics. There is a clear distinction between "A" League of Nations and "The" League of Nations. The Democrats, with some notable exceptions, swallowed "The" League of Nations with their eyes shut, just because Woodrow Wilson told them to. The Republican attitude is that a matter so far reaching in its effects and having so important a bearing on the future of our country should not be taken for granted, but should have the benefit of close study and criticism by the best minds of the nation. And many of the most able men in America, including Democratic statesmen as well as Republicans, have serious doubts of the wisdom of falling in behind this one-man program. The light of "pitiless publicity," which our president so loudly advocated in words, but so entirely forgot in practice, should be returned upon "The" League of Nations before the United States is irrevocably committed to it.

NEVADA GETS A TASTE OF EASTERN WEATHER

The past week in Las Vegas has been one to remind us of the regular old sultry weather of the east. Most of the week there has been some humidity in the atmosphere and the sky has been partially overcast with clouds, adding an element of sultriness to our usual pleasant weather. The nights, too, have been kept at a relatively high temperature by the humidity.

The maximum and minimum temperatures for the 24 hours ending at 6 p. m. on the dates given as recorded by the instruments of the local government weather station are given below:

My only further request of you, is that you give my successor, Major Stelhorn, the same untiring support that you have given me, and this will enable him to continue the same active program of improvement up until the very moment the Americans pull down the flag here and the last Yankee goes home.

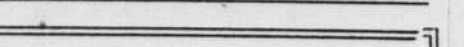
