## "Republic" of Cicero

THE "REPUBLIC" of Cicero, located near Chicago held its regular election last Tuesday. Joseph Z. Klenha was re-elected President by a plurality of 4000 out of 23,000 votes cast.

Despite the fact that 109 officers of the law were imported from Chicago to aid Cicero's 56 local policemen preserve peace and quiet during the election, eighteen Republican and Democratic election workers reported that they had been slugged, beaten or stabbed. In the face of this President Klenha had the nerve to make the following statement in the Chicago Daily Tribune: "It was a very peaceful election. It is a complete vindication of my record. Cicero will continue to be the safest and most economically managed city in the United States."

Among the republican and democratic election workers and officials injured were Gottlieb Waldvogel, Alfred Maznitz, Wm. Pradowskas, Wm. Vakubowski and George Ziterer, distinguished citizens of the "Republic of Cicero".

And still we send the marines to Nicaragua that they may have peaceful elections without bloodshed. Why go to great expense to send missionaries to distant lands to teach the heathen to 'Love thy brother' and become Christians when we have such a running sore in the United States as the "Republic of Cicero"?

## Golden Flower Pot

THE ACCURATE desert scenes are the most popular exhibits at our great international annual flower show held in New York City.

Little do the eastern city dwellers realize that the great American deserts contain one water hole to fifty square miles; that sand storms swirl like water spouts at sea; and its tractless expanse is as large as some eastern states; and the sun rays are as strong as eternal fire and the sands are burning hot. Rain is practically unknown from year to year and on a clear hot day one could see a mirage which looks like a large inland sea fed by rivulets from endless red sand stone canyons, whose walls glisten like red hot iron on a blacksmith's forge. Nature on the desert has protected its plants against lack of water, the boiling sun and insects. Strong sunlight and clear pure air produce hardy desert vegetation.

The far away gaze of the city cave dweller is noticeable, whose cheeks are reddened with caustics instead of nature's bloom. Artificial flowers scented with perfume which could never have been extracted from nature adorn the animal skin coats of the city admirers. They wish they could be transported without physical effort or inconvenience to witness the panorama.

Instead of raising geraniums in tin cans over radiators, Mr. Average Citizen could grow them out of doors all year round on government land in seven western states. Instead of consuming canned vegetables and fruits, one can with a little effort secure and raise his own flowers, fruits and vegetables and the government will even provide the water through irrigation ditches to the homesteader. After five years settlement on public lands and by making a few improvements one becomes his own landlord. With old age getting nearer every day financial independence can be gained through one's own efforts in working a little harder for themselves and family, on their own, and become less dependent on others.

## Let Them Alone

ONE OF THE MOST intelligent remarks concerning railroad legislation made in many moons is a brief paragraph from the St. Louis Times. "Congress could do nothing that would serve more to stabilize all classes of commerce and industry than to adopt a hands off policy toward the railroads. The greatest need of the railroads today is identical with what it has been for the last few years—to be let alone."
