PENNY COMPANY COOPERATING IN CHILD HEALTH

Five years ago Herbert Hoover, president of the American child health association, announced that May 1 shall be observed as National child health day. Hoover said, "I believe the time has come when we, as a nation, shall embody into our articles of faith a pledge to conserve and develop our basic asset of childhood. Our democracy will have finally proved itself when it recognizes the rights of the child equally with the rights of the adult citizen."

As a result of this declaration, women's clubs, churches and schools all over the country are sponsoring May Day celebrations. There have been established 17,000 child health clinics throughout the country. The fifth year finds chairmen in each state organizing large and small communities for a celebration which will include permanent health activities, such as medical examination of school children and the production of pageants, plays and parades. The week of May 1-6 is Child welfare week with the J. C. Penny company. This concern is participating in the national movement by displaying and infant's wear window during those days. The Penny layette has the approval of the American child health association and has met the standards for completeness and health. Those interested in child health literature will be able to procure mothercraft booklets at the local J. C. Penny store. The titles of the booklets are "The Expectant Mother", "The Baby" and "The Child from Two to Six".

MINER KILLED AT KIMBERLY

Martin Kearns was killed instantly Monday morning at 1:20 as a result of a cave-in in the Emma Nevada shaft at Kimberly. According to a report of Coroner Fraser, Kearns and two other miners were timbering the shaft on the 686 foot level. They went on shift at 11:30 p. m. and accompanied by the shift boss, went to the place where they were to work. The boss seeing that the ground was not safe, said that he would send some piling down for a temporary set. While putting in the piling a large boulder fell, bringing with it tons of loose rock, which fell upon Kearns. His skull was fractured.
