### BUICKS LEAD IN FINE CAR SALES

The approach of mid-winter signals no slowing up of automobile sales in California, according to registration figures for October, just released by Motor Registration News. Many of the leading standard makes of automobiles, it is pointed out by executives along San Francisco's Van Ness avenue "Auto Row," revealed healthy increases in sales as compared with the preceding month, while the entire field maintained an average healthy condition.

"Two well known small four cylinder cars selling in the very lowest price class led the state sales list as usual," declared James Cashman, Las Vegas Buick dealer. "Leading the fine car and six-cylinder field came Buick, materially strengthening its proportionate advantage of recent months. Ford in the state of California jumped to a total of 3956 registrations during October; Chevrolet registered 2609 cars, and Buick led its nearest competitor in the fine car field by more than fifty per cent with the high registration total of 1671.

### FATAL BLAST IN MOVIE ARSENAL

BURBANK, Cal., Nov. 14. (AP)—Two were killed and one seriously hurt in the explosion of First National studios arsenal. The French village, the scene of two mimic battles, was razed. Forty actors and actresses worked within a few hundred feet of the arsenal, including Velma Todd, Corinne Griffith, Dorothy Mackall and Creighton Hale, escaped unscathed although the stage was damaged. \$40,000 damage is estimated at the studio.

The two dead are Cecil Irwin and Ray Davis, studio workmen. BURBANK, Cal., Nov. 14. (AP)—One man was killed, another is believed dying and a third was seriously injured when the arsenal of First National film studios near here exploded today. No actors or actresses were hurt. The dead man is Cecil Irwin, a plaster stucco worker, who was engaged in making imitation dishes for studio work.

RARE STAMP SOLD GOTHENBURG, Sweden, Nov. 15. (AP)—One of the rarest stamps in the world, a Swedish three shilling sticker of 1855, misprinted in yellow instead of regular green, has just been acquired by a Gothenburg philatelist, John Ramberg, for 37,500 crowns.

DEER INCREASE MONTREAL, Que., Nov. 15. (AP)—In 1897-98 a herd of 600 white-tailed deer was brought to Anticosti from Virginia. Today the herd numbers 500,000.

LIFE SPAN INCREASES STOCKHOLM, Sweden, Nov. 15. (AP)—Man's span of life in Sweden has increased nearly nine years in less than a century, according to Dr. Emil Liedstrand, Stockholm scientist.

### TRAVELLER DISCOVERS ANCIENT RUSSIAN SECT

OMSK, Siberia, Nov. 15. (AP)—An ancient religious sect called "Through the Hole Worshipers," deported to Siberia two centuries ago by Peter the Great, has been found by Professor Shuckov, north of the Saltain lake. They still pray through holes bored in the walls of their homes, or otherwise, they say, "God wouldn't hear." All of their other ancient customs have remained intact, Professor Shuckov said. The members of the sect lead a sober, isolated life, carefully avoiding contact with more modern folk.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13. (AP)—Dawn of November 11, 10 years ago, found 30 American divisions, greatest military machine in the nation's history, at the front and in reserve in France and Belgium.

The military maps of that day chronicle the fact that in the line ready to continue the drive against the Germans were four "fresh" and 12 "tried" Yankee divisions. In reserves there were three "fresh" and 11 "tried" divisions.

### FRENCH ARMY COSTS \$280,000,000 YEARLY

PARIS, Nov. 15. (AP)—Seven billion francs, \$280,000,000 dollars, is the amount which France will spend in the maintenance and

upkeep of its army during 1929. This does not include the \$80,000,000 appropriated for aviation, which now boasts of a separate ministry. The pay of officers and men, upkeep of material alone amounts to \$180,000,000.

### SCREEN LIFE IN HOLLYWOOD

(AP)—No blows have been struck as yet, nor has there been any hair-pulling, but it is difficult for the peaceful observer in Hollywood to escape noticing film folk alighting themselves into two hostile camps; those who came to pictures from the stage and those who learned all they know in the silence of the voiceless cinema. Some of those who found fame without ever throwing a voice over the footlights feel that some of the stage-trained players are too sure of their superiority in the new talking picture era, and too inclined to give patronizing advice on how to succeed in the new talking medium. Veterans of the stage and screen can be found, on the other hand, who will state frankly that "these dumbbells have had their own way long enough, and from now on we stage-trained people are going to get what's coming to us." There are also, of course, those who suggest that maybe there will be room for everybody after all, and in any case there is no use getting quarrelsome over the matter.

Hollywood's Argument From the recording rooms of the sound-stages where famous film faces are being assayed for voice there come conflicting reports. Colleen Moore, Phyllis Haver, and

other favorites who traveled the silent road to success are said to have passed their voice-tests with ease, and the producer Paul Bern goes so far as to say the best screen voice he has found belongs to the child player, Junior Coghlan, an utter stranger to the footlights. Some directors, on the other hand, say that stage experience in the reading of lines is more important than voice. The public, as usual, will no doubt settle the argument in its own way, at the box-office. Meanwhile the following remark is typical: "Will you believe that she had the nerve to brag about how she learned to place her voice on the stage? She never opened her mouth on th stage! All they ever let her do was dance."

### 7,000 Boys Study Home-Making Science; Kills Petticoat Theory

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15. (AP)—The notion that home economics instruction for boys "will develop them into cooks and seamstresses" has been exploded, and today 7,000 young men in 42 states are being taught the fundamental principles underlying American home life, says the bureau of education of the department of the interior. In Tulsa, Okla., a year of home economics instruction is required of boys before they may be graduated. In Denver, the home economics department has outlined a course entitled "Applied Economics," which is elective by boys in the senior high school. So effective has the course proved that the boys in the junior high school are urging a similar course for themselves, the bureau says. The Manual Arts high school of Los Angeles for a number of years has offered a successful course in home economics to high school boys. "It is now recognized that boys are called upon daily to select food either at home, in the school, or in restaurants," the bureau states. "They often are required to buy clothing, and later in their lives to build, purchase or rent a home and to be co-partners in the rearing of a family. "The greater part of the money that boys will earn through all their lives after they become men will be spent in their homes. A proper understanding of the problems of those homes promises to be of constant practical value to them after they become men and acquire families. "It is also recognized that some phases of home economics education are needed for boys to become intelligent consumers of economic goods and sympathetic participators in home and family life."
