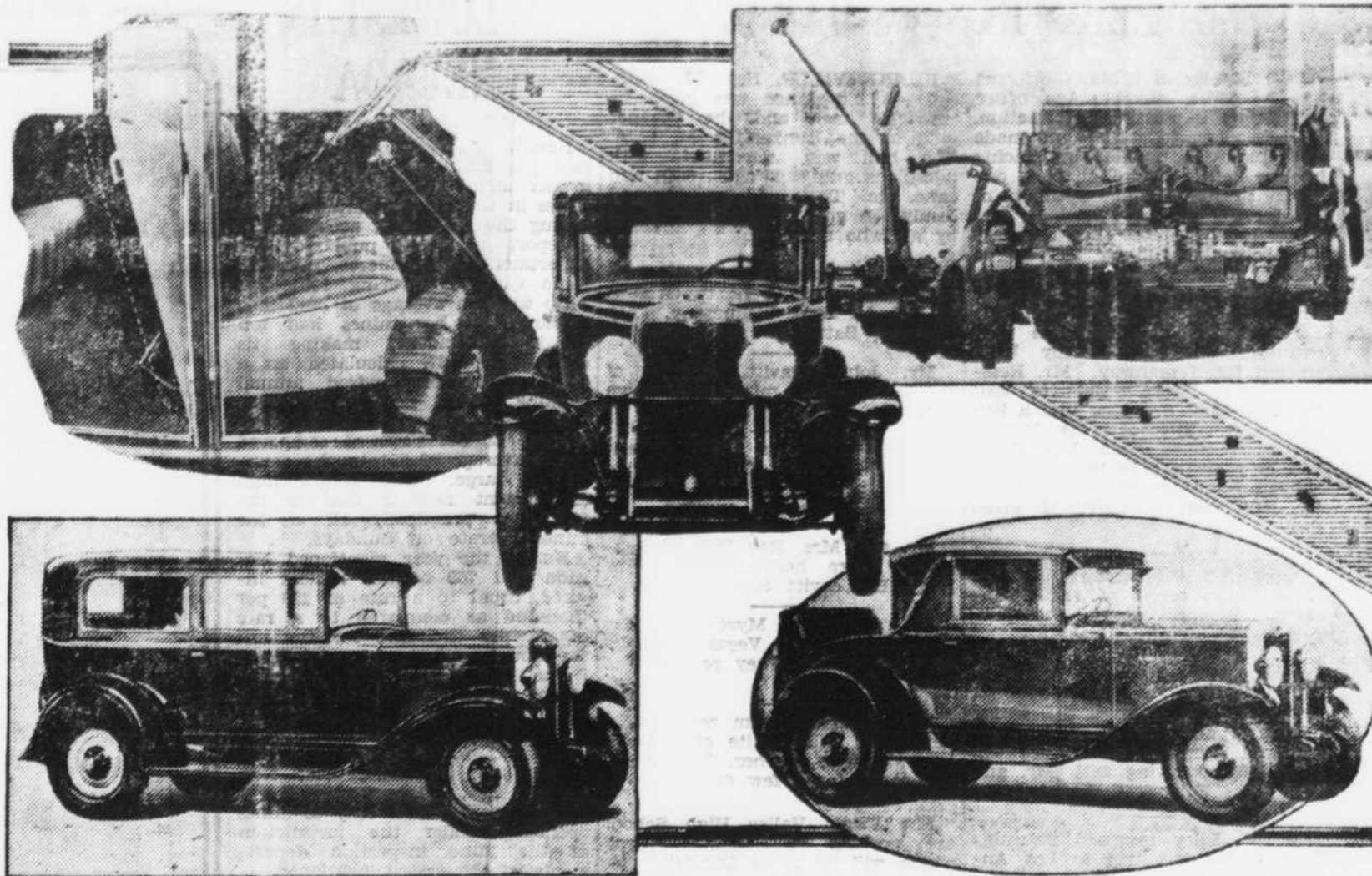

PARIS USES RUBBER CARPETS ON STREETS

PARIS, Nov. 27, (P)—Paris is putting down a rubber carpet at dangerous street-crossings and on steep hills to prevent automobiles from skidding. This novel method of paving is part of the war on asphalt waged by city engineers.

Asphalt, which has a very bad reputation with automobilists in the wet climate of Paris, is still paving fifteen percent of the city's streets, though the highways department has promised to do away with it altogether.

It will take eight years to rid Paris of smooth asphalt. Meanwhile, a kind of rubber carpet, laid on the asphalt, is the best remedy engineers have been able to devise. Rubber mixed with bitumen composes it. One such "carpet" laid down as an experiment in 1926, is still in good condition, and similar ones are to be undertaken at once.

Concrete will also be largely employed in re-paving the streets. Concrete has given excellent results, as an anti-skid surface.

Frau Diel's talks are illustrated by lantern slides. Questions and answers at the conclusion of the lectures show great interest on the part of German women in every phase of American life.

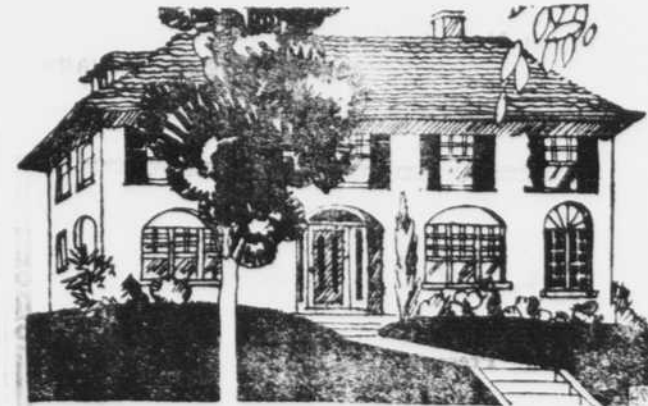
