HOLLYWOOD, Cal., Nov. 27.—Some of the most famous voices in filmdom are being "premiered" on the air these days. The singer usually warbles unannounced, only the attaches of the broadcasting station and certain listeners-in posted at receiving sets by an interested producer knowing his or her identity.
Such anonymous radio appearances are said to be a great help to players inclined to be microphone-shy in the talking picture stages. A few anonymous "flips" of reputation, and may save the player from making a "flop" of his first talking picture appearance.

Taxing Around the Airports

The board of park commissioners of Minneapolis now controls and operates the World-Chamberlin field there. Field rules and regulations have been drawn up and adopted, contracts have been signed by the board and the several transport companies operating from the airport, and a businesslike administration of the airport inaugurated.

The airport at Lansing, Mich., now operates its newly installed lighting system between sunset and midnight, and has made arrangements to keep the lights in operation during the early morning hours upon request. An attendant is on duty 24 hours a day now, and complete weather and flying information can be obtained there.

Albany, N. Y., has drawn up a set of field rules for the government and operates the airport using its airport. The federal air traffic rules were made the basis for the new code.

Leadville, Colo., situated at an altitude of 10,200 feet, is to establish a new airport. The field will have to be larger than most municipal airports because of the high altitude, which requires additional runways and space for landing of airplanes.

Charlottesville, Va., is having difficulty in locating a suitable site for its airport because of the rolling nature of its terrain. Considerable grading will be necessary to put any site the city officials choose into shape.
