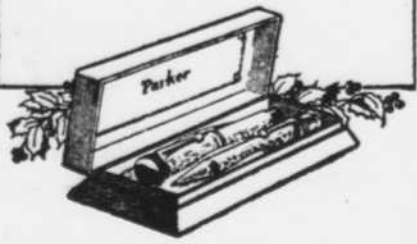

FRED ANDERSON IS RHODES MAN

(Reno Evening Gazette) Fred M. Anderson, a graduate of the University of Nevada with the class of 1928, was appointed Rhodes scholar from Nevada. The announcement of his appointment was made last night by Dr. Frank Aydelotte, president of Swarthmore college and American secretary of the Rhodes trustees.

Anderson will start his work at Oxford in October, 1929, and will take a medical course. While a student of the university he took a prominent part in student affairs, stood third highest in scholastic honors in his class and edited the University of Nevada Sagebrush during his senior year. His home was formerly in Carson where his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Moses Anderson, resided for several years. He is a member of Kappa Lambda fraternity.

John Vernon Cantlon of Sparks and Leslie M. Clover of Woodland, Cal., were the other two candidates from Nevada for the Oxford scholarship. They were classmates of Anderson. Both were highly recommended but Anderson was the choice of the committee that met here Saturday. Cantlon is now attending the Harvard medical school and

Clover is connected with the General Electric Company at Schenectady, N. Y. Anderson is working in Reno.

A board consisting of Dr. Walter Clark, Dr. E. Holman of Stanford university hospital; F. P. Griffith of San Francisco; George Whiteley of Reno; Dr. J. E. Church of Reno, and Charles Chatfield of Reno, made the selection and recommended Anderson for the appointment.

Elections were held in thirty-two states. To qualify, the Rhodes scholar must be either a resident of the state or have received at least two years of his college education in one of the colleges in that state. The award carries an annual stipend of about \$2000.

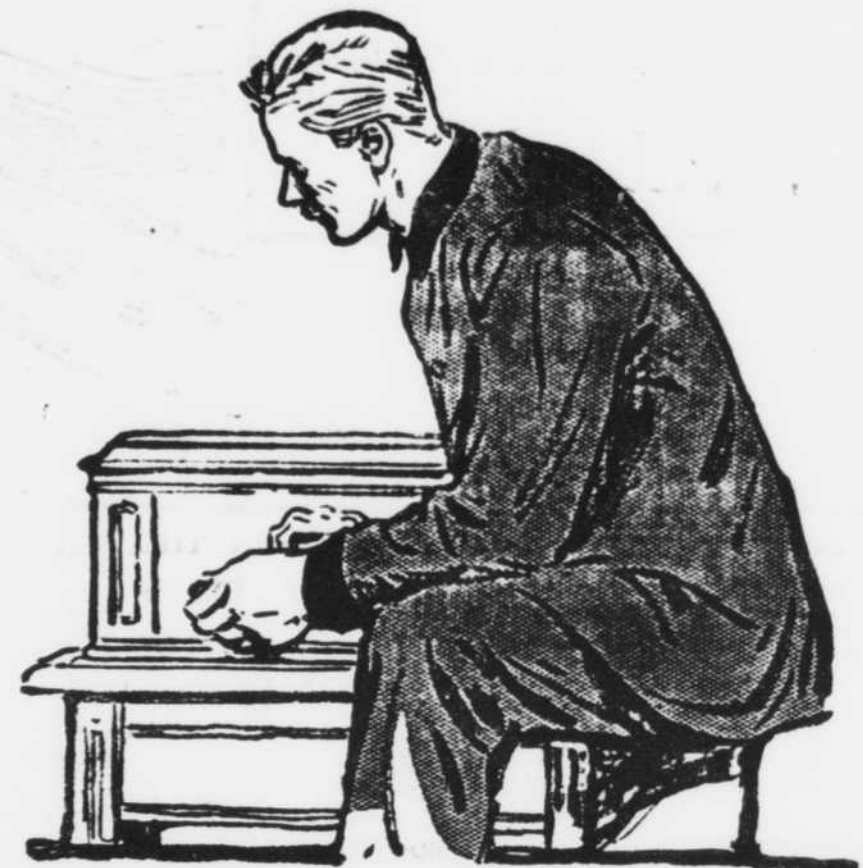
the same period of last year of \$130,158,343.90, a gain of \$21,432,123.68 equivalent to 16.47 percent for the year.
