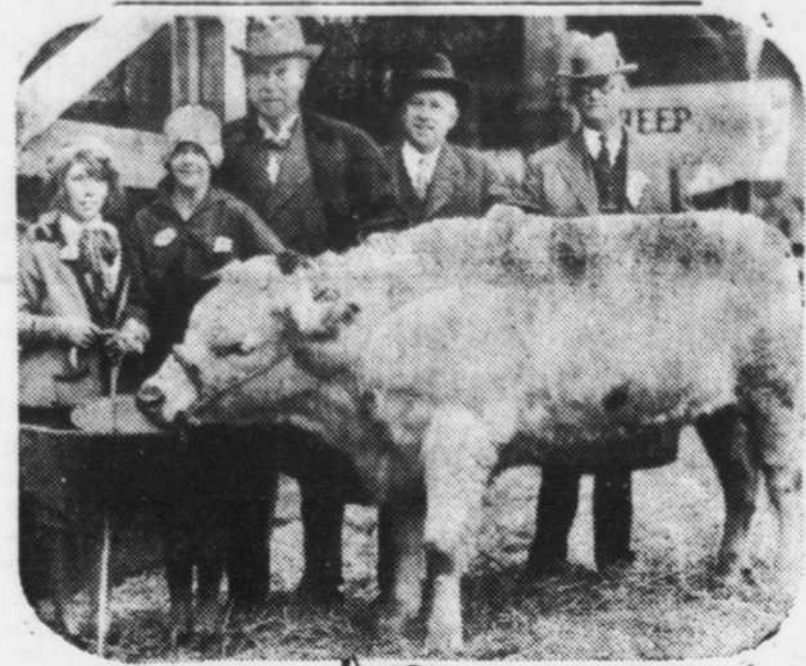


NEVADANS ARE CHAMPIONS

JOS. CARPENTER UTAH PIONEER

The Age reprints the accompanying account of the life of the late Joseph Carpenter, who died recently in Las Vegas, because of the historical interest it contains. The article is taken from the Washington County News, published at St. George.

Funeral services for Jos. W. Carpenter who died in Las Vegas last Wednesday, were held in the Lyceum at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon. Bishop F. G. Miles of the Utah ward presided. A mixed quart sang "Rock of Ages." The opening prayer was offered by John Schautz, Sr. A vocal solo was rendered by Leonard Lamboreaux.

Brigham Jarvis, Jr., was the first speaker. He said he had known Joseph Carpenter for many years and intimately the past 11 years. He was always fair-minded and has shown a great interest in the welfare and upbuilding of this community.

David H. Morris said Joseph Carpenter was a true pioneer. He has seen St. George grow from a scrubbrush-covered valley to what it is today. His father was a member of the Mormon battalion.

In the early days he was a member of the horticultural club, a club organized for the purpose of selecting fruit which would grow best in Dixie. A club house was built for exhibition purposes and is still standing in St. George. He had a hard life, enduring hardships of the early days of Dixie.

On December 15 of the same year Mr. Carpenter issued the first number of the St. George Juvenile, size 5 1/2 by 7 1/2 inches, two columns to the page, with a subscription price of 75 cents for six months. This paper was printed on a hand-made wooden press with the sliding bed and a double lever to raise and lower the platen when the impression was taken.

The St. George Juvenile was published for one year, then the name was changed to the St. George Enterprise, which was published once a month. With the issue of August 14, 1874, Mr. Carpenter quit the newspaper business temporarily and worked with his father at broom-making and coopering, until his marriage in 1875.
