INDIANAPOLIS, Dec. 29, (P)-Ed Jackson, who in 1924 ws elected governor of Indiana with support from the Ku Klux Klan, will end four stormy years of po-litical strife January 14 when Harry G. Leslie, republican gov-ernor-elect, succeeds him.

Jackson's one-time affiliations with D. C. Stephenson, former grand dragon of the Klan now serving a life sentence for murder, were held responsible for many of his difficulties in office. Stephenson, as a power in Indiana politics during Jackson's campaign claimed to have elected him. Preceding last November's elec-tions Jackson's relations with re-

publican party chiefs were strained. He was an uninvited guest at several party rallies. Neither was he called into consultation with republican leaders who feared for Indiana's usual place in the party column.
