The production figures for each months in 1928 follows: January, 231,728; February, 323,796; March, 413,796; April 410,104; May, 425,-783; June, 396,796; July, 392,076; August, 461,298; September, 415,-285; October, 397,096; and November, 256,936. The figures for December, still unavailable, are almost certain to exceed the 1927 mark for the twelfth month of 133,571 automobiles, experts say. Although many factories were

preparing for production of new models and slowed production of their 1928 designs, more motor vehicles were shipped from factories in the United States in November than in the same month
