NEVADA CAR OWNERS USE STATE ASSOCIATION

Carefully kept records in the office of the Nevada State Automobile Association during 1928 show Nevada cars constituted 11.44 per cent of the inquiries. Northern California 43.38 per cent, Southern California 18.02 per cent, Oregon and Washington, 3.29 per cent, and aster 24.17 per cent. Eastbound travel through Reno amounted to 4.38 per cent of the registrants, the westbound movement was 25.92 per cent, northbound, 9.70 per cent, southbound, 14.17 per cent, and local and Nevada travel comprised 1.83 per cent. These figures may be accepted as representing a cross section of the traffic movement across the state during the touring season.
