A Washington Daybook

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19.—Washingtonians, despite the fact they daily are thrown in contact with the highest officials of nation, always are thrilled when one appears without warning in their midst.

A day or so after the Hoover party had returned to the national capital from South America, the wife of the President-elect appeared unannounced one morning at one of the society musicales. This act of Mrs. Hoover was not extraordinary. As wife of the secretary of commerce she frequently attended such functions.

On this occasion, however, there was a commotion as she entered the crowded ballroom where the concert was given. All heads were turned to get a glimpse of the future first lady and there was much whispering.

Two former mistresses of the White House—Mrs. William Howard Taft and Mrs. Woodrow Wilson—also were present. Mrs. Edward E. Gann, the official hostess for vice-President-elect Senator Curtis, also was there.

But it was Mrs. Hoover who attracted all eyes.

A Photographer Jokes
President Coolidge's ride on an ox cart at Sapelo Island and his conversation with Howard Coffin while aboard are still referred to around the capital.

The President, after persuasion by his host, consented to stage the show for the benefit of the photographers and talkie men. They had posted themselves along where the vehicle would pass.

One photographer, a bit farther up the road than his colleagues, was the first to see the ox cart bearing the chief executive. The sight of Mr. Coolidge seated thereon, with his 10-gallon hat pulled far down on his head, the familiar mackinaw drawn snugly about him and the gun clenched firmly in his hands was too much. Although he had seen many peculiar situations before and recorded them with his camera, he was unable to contain himself. Turning to his colleagues, he shouted:

"Boys, you can believe it or not, but here comes our President!"

COOLIDGE SIGNS KELLOGG PACT

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17, (AP)—With ceremony appropriate to what he considers one of the principal achievements of his administration, President Coolidge affixed his signature to the instrument of ratification of the Kellogg anti-war pact, proclaiming to the world that the United States approved in full the entire cabinet and a large representation from the senate were present when Coolidge signed the document, using a gold pen which was presented to Secretary Kellogg by the City of Havre, France, when Kellogg went abroad last summer to sign the treaty at Paris.

Under the glare of blinding camera lights accompanied by grinding motion picture machines the President entered the east room shortly after signing the treaty and two copies immediately.

THREE KILLED BY WINDSTORM

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Jan. 18, (AP)—A windstorm sweeping across southern Indiana and Illinois today was reported to have caused the death of two school children at Manuie, Ill., and the death of a woman at Fort Branch, Ind.

Much property damage was caused.

COM. HAINES DROPS DEAD

LONDON, Jan. 18, (AP)—Commissioner Haines, vice-president of the High Council of the Salvation Army, in session here, dropped dead last night.

NEW PRESIDENT WILL NAME PROHI BOARD

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17, (AP)—President-elect Hoover is to appoint a special commission to investigate prohibition and general law violations as well as court procedure, after March 4 it was learned today. He will also make a

recommendation looking to the improvement of the entire law enforcement question.

This information came after Hoover had been closeted with Senators Jones of Washington, and Edge of New Jersey, respective leaders of the wet and dry forces of the Senate. The Senators advised the next President of their decision to abandon their resolutions which authorize a prohibition inquiry.
