PHOENIX, Jan. 26, (P)—Under an avalanche of opposition the house today killed Senate Bill No. 1 by Favour of Yavapai county, which sought to create a new Colorado River Commission with members to be appointed by the governor with the approval of the senate and which also included an appropriation of \$100,000 for the use of the commission.

The vote was 29 for the bill to 21 against, a two-thirds majority being required.

A resolution was then adopted authorizing the speaker of the house to appoint a committee to draft a bill creating a new commission under provisions which will meet the approval of the

The main objection to the bill voiced in the house was to the surrender of full power in the Colorado River controversy to the governor and the commission.
