### CLEANING HOUSE

CALIFORNIA seems to be entering upon a campaign of general house cleaning

The Julian oil frauds in which thousands were robbed and the chief criminals allowed to escape justice; the Aimee McPherson scandals; the Asa Keyes case in which it is asserted the district attorney accepted large sums of money and valuable gifts from friends interested in freeing the criminals; and the case of Judge Hardy, whom the state legislature is trying on the charge that he, a superior court judge, accepted a \$2,500 check from Aimee McPherson for services; all these things have brought California's reputation for the enforcement of justice somewhat into disrepute.

It appears, however, that public opinion has been awakened. In the prosecutions now under way in some of these cases there appears to be a vigorous effort to convict those who may be found guilty of illegal practices quite in contrast with former seemingly half-hearted prosecutions in which the malfactors one after the other escaped punishment.

A good house cleaning in California would be beneficial.

### CUTTING JUDICIAL DISTRICTS

WHILE ANY REASONABLE PLAN for reducing the expense of conducting the judicial business of the State should meet with the approval of all citizens, it appears to us that the bill introduced by Assemblyman Branson of White Pine county fails to take into consideration the imminent growth of Las Vegas and Clark county.

The plan introduced provides for the combining of Clark, Esmeralda, Lincoln, Mineral and Nye counties into one judicial district with one judge at a salary of \$5,000 a year.

In this district as at present, Clark and Lincoln counties, the district judge is already worked just about to the limit of endurance. The business of Clark county in the district court is increasing and all indications point to a much more rapid increase in the future.

If a readjustment of judicial districts of the state is necessary it would seem wise to establish Clark county alone as one district and to combine Lincoln county with another district in which court business is not so congested.

### GREAT CHARACTER

TO MEET MEN who have achieved real greatness in any line is always of interest and generally a pleasure.

Las Vegas last week entertained Carl Laemmle, who is one of the outstanding pioneers of the motion picture business and has arisen to the very head of the industry as President of the Universal organization.

Carl Laemmle has none of the arrogance which the public is used to associating with great wealth and power. On the contrary he is of a gentle and modest disposition, kindly, considerate and companionable.

Which reminds us that after all, those are generally qualities of real greatness. The writer has met a considerable number of men who have achieved greatness of various sorts and it is noticeable that nearly all display the same human qualities which are so outstanding in Carl Laemmle. Incidentally, speaking of wealth, Mr. Laemmle says that he has all the money he wants and is interested only in working for the improvement of motion pictures and the industry generally. There are many others with whom money has ceased to be the objective, but who continue their busy lives for the advancement of their ideals.

Which reminds us again, that while a certain amount of money is necessary and desirable, money alone is by no means the sole objective of great minds.

## Menus of the Day

**Croquette Measurements**  
1 1/4 quarts of food mixture will be sufficient for making 25 croquettes. There are 6 cups in 1 1/2 quarts.

**Sunday Tea in Winter Menu**  
Coal Meat Platter  
Sardine Sandwiches  
Celery Stuffed with Roquefort Cheese

Cheese Snacks Ripe Olives  
Chocolate Nrop Cakes Tea or Coffee  
This menu is planned to serve buffet style and all the foods may be made some time prior to the serving.

Nut bread or lettuce sandwiches may be substituted for the sardine if the hostess prefers.

**Sardine Sandwiches**  
12 thinly cut slices of white bread.

4 tablespoons butter.  
1/2 cup sardines, broken apart with a silver fork.  
1/4 cup finely chopped sweet pickles.

4 tablespoons mayonnaise.  
Mix the butter until soft and creamy. Add the sardines, pickles and mayonnaise and spread upon the slices of bread. Arrange sandwich fashion and cut off the crusts with a sharp knife. Place the sandwiches on a tray or in a basket.

**Meat Platter**  
1/2 pound thinly sliced cold boiled ham.

1/2 pound sliced liverwurst.  
1/2 pound sliced roast veal (left from Sunday dinner).

4 hard boiled eggs, cut in halves.  
1 lemon, thinly sliced.

**Parsley.**  
Overlap the slices of ham, liverwurst and veal, of course alternating the different kinds. Arrange

the eggs around the edge and place the lemon slices at regular intervals on top of the meat. Garnish with the parsley.
