ANOTHER CONFERENCE

The state of Arizona, according to John C. Phillips, its governor, is ready to enter upon further negotiations having for their object the conclusion of a lower basin compact under which Nevada, California and Arizona will mutually bind themselves to an exact definition of their water and power rights in the Colorado River. For six years the states mentioned have been negotiating to this same end, without having made one progressive step toward its successful conclusion, and finally the United States congress, through the Swing-Johnson bill, specifically defined those rights as it saw them. Under the provisions of the bill the three lower basin states can

accept the congressional definition or they can, if they wish, modify them. If the three states fail to agree, then, under the Swing-Johnson bill, two of them can accept the congressional definition, or they can, if they so wish, alter them. If, however, any lower basin compact that is negotiated, whether by two states or by all three of them, departs in any way from the allocations of water and power set forth by the Swing-Johnson bill, the compact so negotiated must be ratified by congress before it can become effective.

To put the situation very plainly both Nevada and California are satisfied with the definition of rights set forth in the Swing-Johnson bill. Neither of the states mentioned was able to persuade

congress to concede to it some of the things upon which it insisted, but both believe that the compromises finally effected, before the bill was passed, were the fairest and best that ever could be obtained and they were glad to end the long struggle.

Arizona is still dissatisfied, and in asking for another conference her object is not to accept the allocations made by congress but to change them.
