SAN FRANCISCO **IN BROADCAST OF VEGAS TALK**

In a publicity dispatch which is being broadcast by the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce, the long distance telephone conversation between Dr. Roy W. Martin, President of the local chamber and Philip J. Faye, President of the San Francisco Chamber is given in detail.

The Age herewith prints the dispatch verbatum:

Las Vegas, Nevada, came within talking distance of San Francisco and the rest of the world for the first time today (Thursday, January 31).

President Philip J. Fay of the San Francisco Chamber of Com-merce, and Dr. Roy W. Martin of the Las Vegas Chamber, had the honor of being the first to hold Bell System through the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company.

While Las Vegas has a local telephone system, it heretofore has never had long distance connections

President Fay was surrounded by members of the Board of Directors at the regular weekly meeting of the Board, when the conversa-tion was started. The call came fro mLas Vegas. It was as follows: Conversation

"Mr. Fay ,I am talking from Las Vegas, Nevada, and I want to introduce to you Dr. Roy W. Martin, president of the Chamber of Commerce of Las Vegas.


"Mr. Fay, we are using a loud speaker here for the benefit of the assembled guests, and would ask that you speak slowly and loudly so that we can all hear what you have to say."


Governor John C. Phillips today formally announced the names of the new Arizona Colorado River Commission.

The new members of the commission are as follows:


John M. Ross, Warren, Ariz.; C. B. Ward, Phoenix; and State Sentaor A. H. Favour, Prescott.

Las Vegas is the county seat of Clark County, Nevada. It has a population of approximately 7,000. It is the only town near this size that at present has had no outlet or connection with the Bell Telephone System. The town is provided with telephone service by 'he Las Vegas Consolidated Power &

Telephone Company. In recognition of the Boulder Dam project, which is but a short from Las Vegas, and distance which is the largest national project since the construction of the Panama Canal, it becomes imperative that outside telephone connections be had and the Bell System has arranged for a toll line 200 miles long to give the service. 
