## DEFENSE RESTS IN KEYES TRIAL

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 31, (AP)—The defense rested its case in the bribery trial of Asa Keyes and two co-defendants shortly before noon today. The state immediately prepared to call several rebuttal witnesses.
