When Broiling Steak, Remember—
Broil without salt, as salt draws out the juices. Cook over a hot fire, turning frequently, searing both sides. Place on a hot platter, salt and pepper to taste, spread top with butter and serve at once.

New Receipts for Kraut

In bottom of buttered baking dish place a layer of kraut, then a layer of cooked egg-noodles and a layer of crumbled sausage; re-peat until dish is filled; place whole sausages on top and bake slowly until the meat is browned (about 1 hour).

Pineapple Waldorf Salad

Pare, quarter and core 3 apples and cut into tiny cubes. Add 1 cup drained crushed pineapple, 1/2 cup chopped walnuts and 1/2 cup chopped celery. Mix with thick may-connaise and serve on lettuce.

Baked Date Pudding

1 cup sugar, 3 eggs beaten light, 1 tablespoon flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 cup chopped nuts, 1 cup chopped dates, 1/2 cup cracker crumbs. Bake in moderate oven. Serve with whipped cream.

Prevents Rust on Tinware

Before using new tinware, rub well with lard and stand it in a hot oven until thoroughly heated. This will prevent rust in future use.

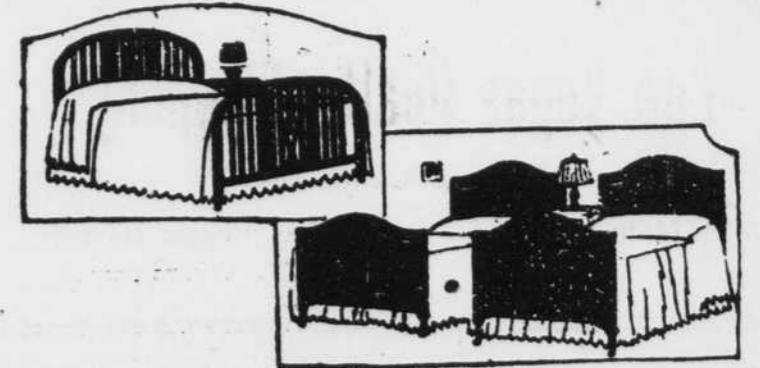
