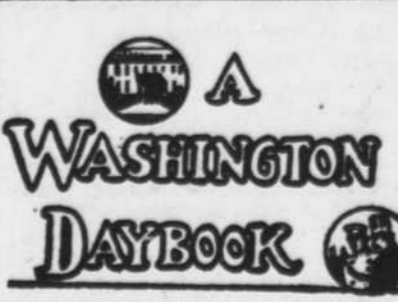

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9. — Rudolph Block refuses to carry a cane, but he has traveled thousands of miles and spent a small fortune in collecting 1,400 of them.
 A cane in itself holds no appeal for Block, but the wood does. Years of following his strange hobby has led him to Formosa for camphor wood, to India for sandalwood, to Australia for raspberry-wood—in fact, over the seven seas into every part of the world. He has found every known wood and many that were unknown.
 The results of his long quest have been turned over to the United States government and form a part of the educational collections at the national museum.
 History, superstition and tribal traditions are found in these sticks.

Some idea as to the value of this strange collection may be had by remembering that Block spent \$50,000 alone in getting handles made for his sticks.
