 Graperuit Cocktail topped with a red cherry
 Creamed Salmon in Patty Cases
 Buttered Green Beans
 Bread and Butter Sandwiches.
 Heart Shaped
 Pimento Gelatin Salad
 Cheesed Crutons
 Currant Jelly Cake Desert Coffee

Pimento Gelatin Salad, Serving 6
 1 package lemon flavored gelatin mixture.
 12-3 cups boiling water.
 1 tablespoon sugar.
 2 tablespoons vinegar.
 1/2 teaspoon salt.

1 cup chopped celery.
 1-3 cup chopped pimentos.
 1/4 cup chopped green peppers.
 6 pimento hearts, 1 inch wide.
 Pour the water over the gelatin mixture and stir until it has dissolved. Add the sugar, vinegar and salt. Add the celery, chopped pimentos and green peppers. Pour to the thickness of 1 1/4 inches in a pan, which has been rinsed out of cold water. Set in a cool place. When a little thick, place the pimento hearts on the top. Chill. When ready to serve, cut in squares with teh hearts on the top. Serve in cups of lettuce and surround with salad dressing.
 To prepare the pimento hearts, split the pimentos and lay them flat. Cut out the hearts with a paper pattern or heart vegetable cutter. There will be no waste as the rest of the pimentos may be chopped and used in the salad.
Cheesed Cruton Hearts
 12 slices bread, 1/4 inch thick.
 3 tablespoons butter.
 4 tablespoons white cream cheese.
 1/4 teaspoon salt.
 1/4 teaspoon paprika.

Cut ou the bread in heart shapes. Mix the butter, cheese and salt. Carefully spread on the hearts. La fyla t ni a shallow pan and brown in a moderate oven. Sprinkle with the paprika. Serve the hearts with their edges overlapping on a flat dish.
 Arrows cut from gold card board may be inserted in the hearts, if the hostess desires.
 These are delicious and very effective and may be served with soups or salads.
