DYING INDIAN TRIBE IGNORANT OF ORIGIN

BLACKWELL, Okla., Mar. 2--Linguists have set out to record the langauge of that unusual tribe of American Indians, the Ton-

This unit among the 2,000 tribes and 54 linguistic stocks found west of the Mississippi for years has baffled students of Indian lore. Now, with only 42 survivors in the Tonkawa clan, the American Association for the Advancement of Science is trying to trace the tribe's history.

Never were the Tonkawas related in language or customs, so far as is known, to neighboring Indians whom the white man found when he came into Texas. They were known as a more primttive people. The Spaniards called them cannibals.

The remaining Tonkaws, now living on a reservation near here know little of their forefathers. Most of the tribes were killed when their Indian enemies banded together and slew nearly 600 in a raid during the civil war.

Students of other tribes have been puzzled by pecularities in the Tonkawas' tongue not found in any other Indian language. Their aloofness from other tribes prevented any spread of the Tonkawa speech, which is now being studied,
